RADIO REBUKE DRAWS FIRE IN COMMONS

Government, Bishop
And BBC Attacked
By Labor Members.

LONDON, Dec. 17.—"Jock" McGovern, a member of Parliament from the Clyde, rose in the House of Commons today to tell the Bishops to "get out and find unemployment instead of kicking a man when he's down."

Bringing into the open the ill-feeling of some Parliamentarians against the Archbishop of Canterbury for his radio rebuke of former King Edward, McGovern, once a plumber, said the cabinet acted like "a lot of huffy old women if they don't get their way," and added:

"If the issue (of Edward's marriage) had been put to the country, he would have beaten the Cabinet. The Prime Minister would have gone, but the man (Edward) would have remained."

McGovern, who shouted out from the bar of the House of Lords three years ago, just as King George V finished his speech from the Throne, that "you are a gang of lazy, idle parasites," came to the defence of George's son today.

"Let the Bishops deal with unemployment instead of kicking a man when he is down," he said. "Let them go on the wireless and try to arouse the indignation and the conscience of the nation against social injustices that the common people suffer."

He said he had seen children killed by bombs in Spain and added: "That action was cruel and deadly, but swift and sudden. Death is being dealt out to millions of children in this country. It is like putting them into a compartment which the life is slowly pushed out of their bodies."

He advised that the Cabinet and "the Bishops never mind Mrs. Simpson" and declared "we are all willing to relieve" Prime Minister Baldwin and his Cabinet "if they want to go."

His speech served as a prelude to what may be a more extended attack on the British Broadcasting Corporation for transmitting the Archbishop's speech.

Some members wanted to know if the speech, as well as the one which Edward made after his abdication, were first submitted to Government officials through the BBC.

Even before the crisis, inquiries into other phases of BBC activities had been shaped up for general debate. The Corporation's charter expires Dec. 31.

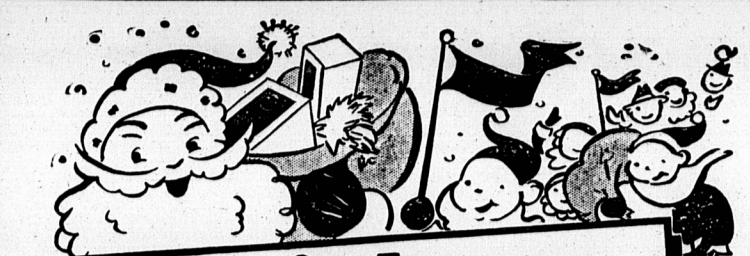
H. B. Lees-Smith, Postmaster-General in the last Labor Government, opening the regular BBC debate tonight, charged that "terrorism" was employed in the management of the Corporation's affairs.

"The question of staff associations," he said, "leads to continual complaint... on terrorism, favoritism and intrigue as the means by which the internal administration of the Corporation is carried on."

He said his friends in BBC "have warned me I must not telegraph to them because the telephone will be tapped... they tell me no; to write to them at the Corporation and they are not sure their letters will not be opened."

He continued: "The BBC has become an autocracy. It is the nearest thing to Nazi Government that can be shown."

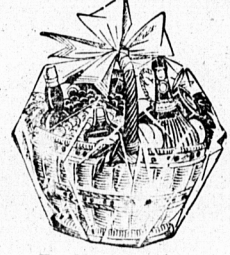

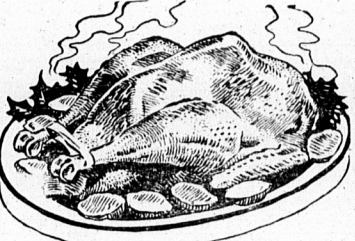

Wholesalers Hold "Service" Meetings

SAINT JOHN, N. B., Dec. 17.—Wholesalers of the seven zones in the Maritime Merchants' Alliance concluded the second of a series of "service" meetings here this afternoon. C. R. Manning, Windsor, N. S., presided. Another meeting will be held in January.

The gatherings were organized for discussion of methods to effect better co-operative buying and merchandising and to devise ways of pooling purchases from outside points. Intensive work is directed toward a detailed comparison of goods manufactured in the Maritimes and elsewhere.

The seven zones in the Alliance are those with wholesaler distribution centres at Saint John, Fredericton, Moncton, Woodstock and Campbellton, in New Brunswick, and Amherst and Windsor, in Nova Scotia.
