

"WIRELESS" MUSIC FOR PARISIANS

PARIS, Nov. 12. (Special)—Residents of the Champs de Mars, the former site of great exhibitions and now one of the most beautiful quarters of Paris, have long complained of the loud crackling noise of the wireless telegraph apparatus on the Eiffel Tower, as an objectionable feature of the locality.

The nuisance was removed this week with the installation by the military authorities of more powerful machines for the purpose of doubling the efficiency of the stations a feature of the new appliances is that they are fitted with "musical antennae," the effect of which resembles an aeolian melody instead of the whip-cracking noise.

The authorities are now considering the form of an audible signal to be flashed from the Eiffel Tower at noon each day, giving the exact time to the entire city.

GREECE READY TO DECLARE NEW WAR

ATHENS, Nov. 12. (Special)—Public sentiment here is growing more anxious as regards the outcome of the Greco-Turkish negotiations. In a number of conversations I have had with Ministers, parliamentarians and diplomatists, I find this feeling of anxiety is shared in official circles.

It is remarked that a common ground for agreement was found thirteen days ago, but Turkey, on one excuse or another, refuses to sign the treaty of peace.

The last time the two governments were in union the Turks delayed final action thirty days and then reopened the whole question.

SEEK COMPROMISE ON THE SUFFRAGE

LONDON, Nov. 11. (Special)—Decided efforts are being made to induce the British government to come to an agreement with the suffragists whereby a measure for the enfranchisement of women can be made a section of the official programme of the liberal party, now in power.

Some of the suffragist leaders admit that this movement has obtained considerable headway, and a significant feature of the conferences which have been held is the presence at them of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick William Pethick-Lawrence, who left the fold of the Women's Social and Political Union, the militant organization, at the request of Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst, and who took with them their journal, Votes for Women.

It is known that the government will consider only a compromise based on an unqualified repudiation of the Women's Social and Political Union and all of its militant methods. Hitherto the constitutional suffragists have refused to criticize formally the actions of their militant sisters, declaring it was bad tactics in the face of the common enemy to question the actions of the militant organization, but several of the prominent constitutional suffragist leaders express themselves as willing to abandon their attitude in regard to the fighting section.

They declare they have become convinced that suppression of the militants is the only hope of procuring the Parliamentary suffrage for women, which is the only form of political activity denied to them in the British Isles, where they possess the municipal suffrage and may hold every civic office outside of Parliament.



NO WONDER THE TOWNS-PEOPLE KICKED

SEABORN, Alsace, Germany, Nov. 10.—A violent outbreak of indignation accompanied by riots, was brought about in this little garrison town last evening by the publication of some remarks of Lieut. Bacon Von Forster of the 90th infantry to the recruits of his company while he was instructing them as to the manner in which they should conduct themselves towards the townspeople.

The lieutenant said he would award the sum of \$2.50 to any of his soldiers who "ran through any Alsatian vagabond" molesting him.

A crowd of angry residents waylaid the lieutenant during the afternoon at a house where he was making a call and he was obliged to send for a squad of soldiers, who armed with loaded rifles, escorted him to his residence. In the evening thousands of people besieged the officers' club. The police were powerless and the firemen were summoned to disperse the crowd with the help of their hose, but the pipes were soon cut by some of the more daring. Troops were then called out and with loaded rifles and fixed bayonets cleared the streets. A sergeant of the regiment who was reported to have told the recruits he would add 75 cents to the lieutenant's \$2.50 was caught by the crowd, dragged into an alley and badly mishandled. No denial has been issued of the lieutenant's remarks.

LIVED UNDER SIX BRITISH SOVEREIGNS.

GUELPH, Ont., Nov. 10.—Mrs. John Mitchell died at her home on Queen Street last night in her hundredth year. She lived under six British sovereigns. Several months ago when a son of Mrs. Mitchell died the strange event occurred of a man of eighty being buried from his mother's residence.

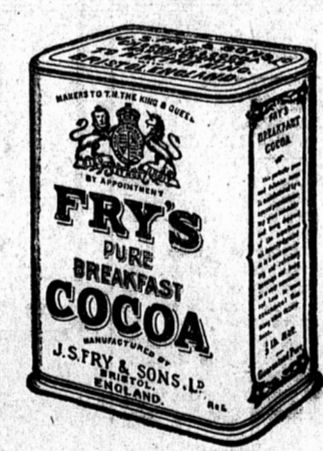
