Last-March was a memorable month, and during the present severe winter it is interesting to recall some unusual occurrences of one year ago. On March 3rd 1904 a heavy electrical storm passed over the province the lightning striking the spire of St. Paul's Church, Summerside, doing considerable damage. On the 21st of the same month the shock of an earthquake was felt in our town.

Mayor Compton and a party of men drove out to the edge of the board ice Thursday and took measurements of the depth of the ice. In no place was it thicker than twenty inches while in most places it was only twelve inches deep. They also report that the board ice is perfectly smooth. There is no piled up ice, and a wide strip of open water extends from Fifteen Point down the strait as far as the eye can reach.
