## Boston Again Defeat Maroons

### "Tiny" Thompson, In Bruin Net Was Hero Of Game—Winners Scored Three Goals In Four Minutes.

MONTREAL, March 23.—Boston Bruins gained a strangle hold on the opening series of the Stanley Cup by taking their second consecutive game from Montreal Maroons 4-2 here last night. The almost unbeatable Bruins played their usual brilliant game and except for a few minutes in the first and final periods, the Boston squad had a definite margin of superiority throughout.

#### THE PERIODS

The first period was the most even of the game although even here the Bruins showed a slight edge. Neither team tried as hard as they might have, both sending out two man attacks which immediately returned to their own blue line when unsuccessful. Boston played cautiously, waiting for their chance, while the Maroons, with everything to gain and little to lose, put all they had into the game.

## Rangers Win From Ottawa 5-2

(Canadian Press) NEW YORK, Mar. 23.—The New York Rangers advanced to the semi-finals of the play-offs for the Stanley Cup tonight by defeating the Ottawa Senators 5 to 2 in the second and last game of the series between the third place teams of the National Hockey League. Combined with a 1 to 1 tie in the first encounter, tonight's victory gave the Rangers a margin of six goals to three for the series.

## Does Not Look Bright For The Big Hockey Tour

LONDON, March 23.—Proposals to bring hockey teams from the American continent, probably from Canada, for a series of exhibition games in England in the near future, were being discussed in skating circles.

There are no definite arrangements yet, however. The venture is attributed to a prominent British sportsman who recently visited Canada and the United States. In the opinion of one English authority, there is not at the moment, a single ring in the United Kingdom which could accommodate a sufficient crowd to show a profit of \$500 out of a hockey match, even leaving out the question of the payment of professional players. It is believed that nothing further will be heard of the project until a suitable arena is available.

## Millionaires Trimmed 3 to 0

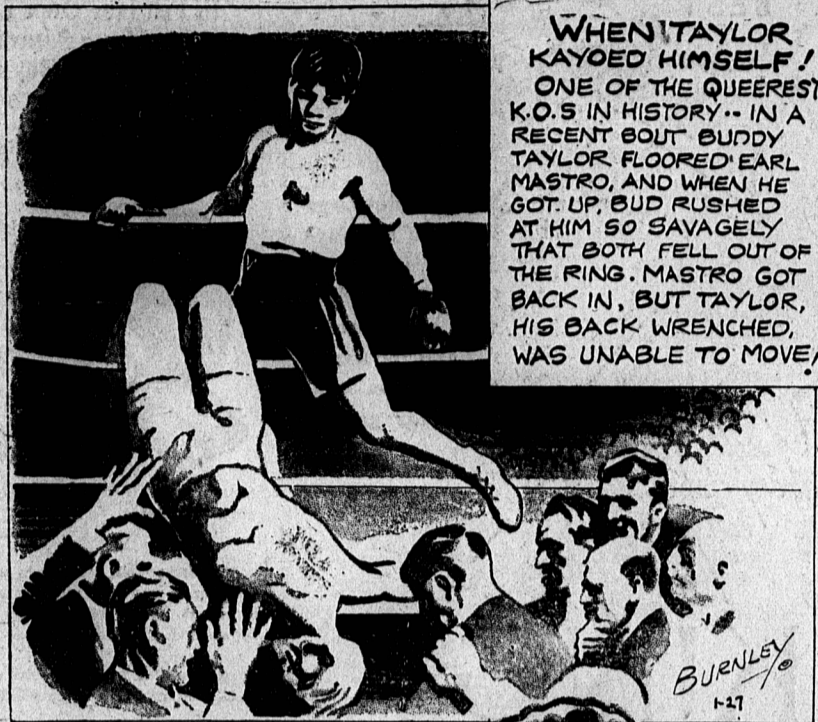
