OF INTEREST TO LOBSTER MEN.—Lobster fishermen will be interested to learn that the Department of Fisheries intends issuing early in April a circular giving valuable suggestions on the correct methods of packing lobsters. This has been found necessary owing to the bad condition of a large portion of the pack of last year, which made sales almost impossible. The pamphlet is being prepared by Inspector S. T. Gallant of Charlottetown who is thoroughly conversant with all the requirements of packing.

SMELT FISHING.—Although many were disappointed at not obtaining an extension of the smelt fishing season it may be all the better for the future of the industry, as there is no doubt there would have been a large catch during the full moon tides and over-fishing of any fisheries is not desirable. It is interesting to note that in the year 1919 the total catch in the Province was valued at \$51,594, while the catch of 1920 was valued at \$87,248. There are the prices which were paid to fishermen at the boatside. The price realized on the market was \$119,044.

IN MEMORIAM THE LATE ALBERT SABINE

A familiar figure in Charlottetown has passed away in the person of Mr. Albert Sabine who for 33 years was the courteous and efficient delivery man for Frowse Bros., Ltd. Mr. Sabine passed away at the P. E. Island Hospital at 3 o'clock yesterday morning. It is only five weeks ago since he entered the hospital for treatment where it was ascertained that he was suffering with that dread disease, cancer of the stomach and that it had reached the stage where there was no hope of saving his life. Though Mr. Sabine must have been suffering for a considerable time with this malady he made no complaints and ever preserved his cheerful outward appearance. He was an excellent citizen and a faithful employee with many fine traits of character who will be greatly missed. He is survived by his widow who was formerly a Miss Graves, and by two sisters in California and one in Honolulu. The deceased was a member of the Sons of England and of the Orange Association in which order he was much esteemed.
