BERLIN, January 16.—The German government has transmitted to Great Britain through the American embassy, a note which declares that as a result of Great Britain not fulfilling Germany's demand for an explanation of the circumstances surrounding the sinking of a German submarine by the British patrol boat Baralong, Germany will adopt suitable measures of reprisal.

Earl Kitchener declared he had not believed conditions so terrible, so difficult and so overwhelming in their nature could exist.
