The schooner Sea Fern, from Georgetown, P. E. I. for Clarke's Harbor, with potatoes and turnips, and oats, put in Wednesday for a harbor, having lost her foremast and part of her deckload.—Halifax Chronicle.

There was not a large attendance at market yesterday. Geese and fowl were plentiful the former selling from 80 cents to \$1.25 and the latter from 60 to 75 cents per pair. Ducks sold at 55 cents each to \$1.20 per pair. Potatoes sold at 24 to 25 cents, oats 51 to 52 cents, hay \$16, turnips 11 cents and straw \$6 per ton.

Colonel James F. Wilson, commandant of the Fortress and Artillery School, Quebec, has been retired on account of ill health. He has been granted the honorary rank of Major General. Lieut. Col. R. W. Rutherford is made a full Colonel and succeeds to the Quebec command. Major J. O. Thacker becomes director of Artillery in place of Colonel Rutherford.

There is much anxiety and excitement at Georgetown concerning the fate of the schooner Halycon. This vessel left Souris on Wednesday evening last just before the storm. There was no captain on board. The three men in the vessel knew little about the management of a schooner and the schooner was practically empty. The names of the three men were: James Stewart of Woodville, a man with a large family; Howard Poole, son of John T. Poole, also of Woodville, and Charles Reeves of Newport. Since their departure from Souris at 9.30 o'clock on Wednesday evening nothing has been heard of either vessel or men. The Halycon was owned by Capt. John White, of Georgetown. She had last been employed in taking a load of laths from Newport to Souris, and was to have returned to Georgetown. John T. Poole, father of one of the missing young men, and William Sigsworth, left Georgetown for Boughton Island in the hope of obtaining some information concerning the missing vessel and men.

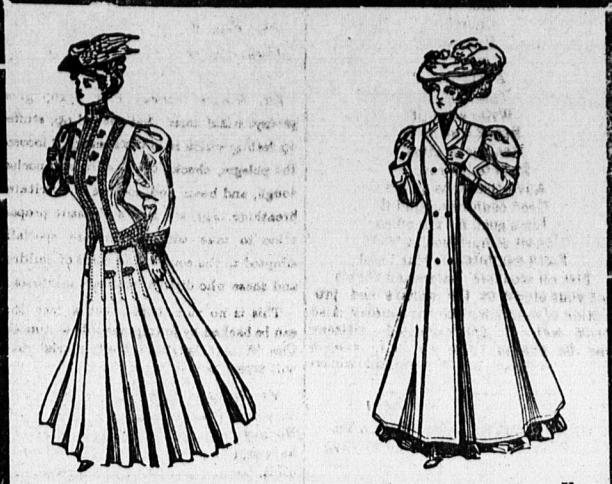
