SUCCESSFUL YEAR.—The report of the season's work of the Orwell Dairying Co., which has just closed, is very encouraging. The amount of cheese made was 73,060 lbs from 759,057 lbs. of milk supplied by the ninety patrons. The total amount of fat in milk was 28,666 lbs., making an average price of \$1.11 1/2 per hundred lbs. milk. The two patrons supplying the largest amount of milk for cheese and butter were D. R. MacDonald, 49,901 lbs. and Donald McKenzie, 41,229 lbs. The manager, Mr. Wm. F. Brown, of Pownal, was successful in taking 4th prize at the Exhibition last fall from one cheese of each month's make during the season.—Com.
