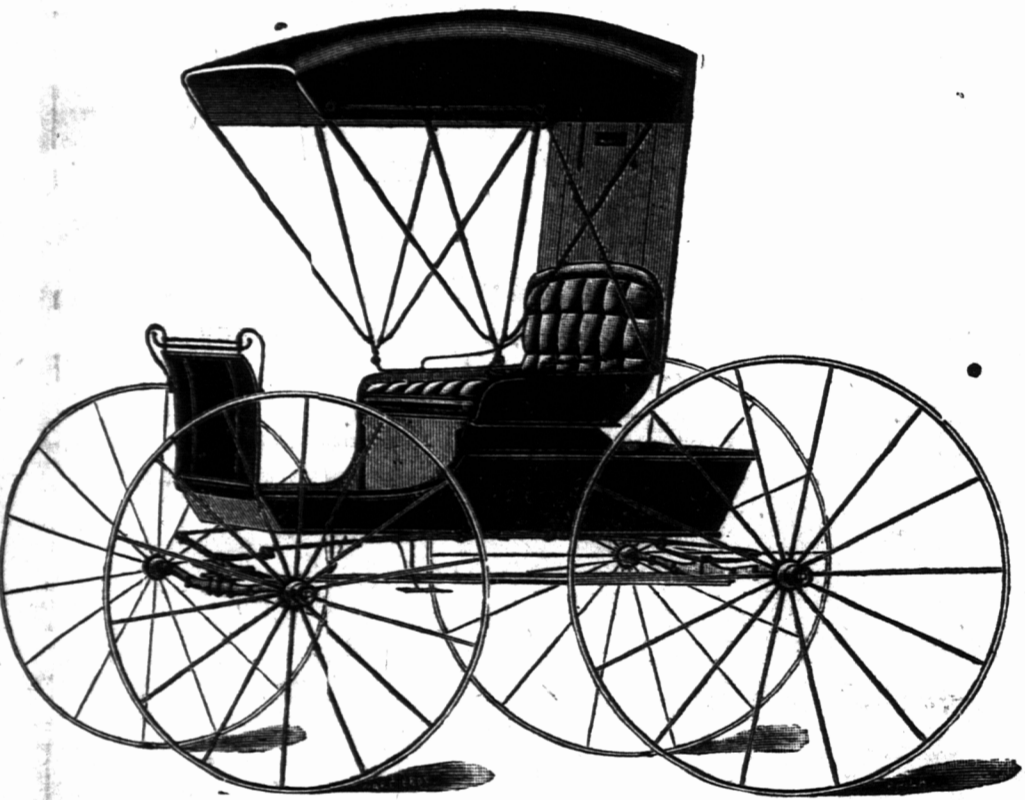

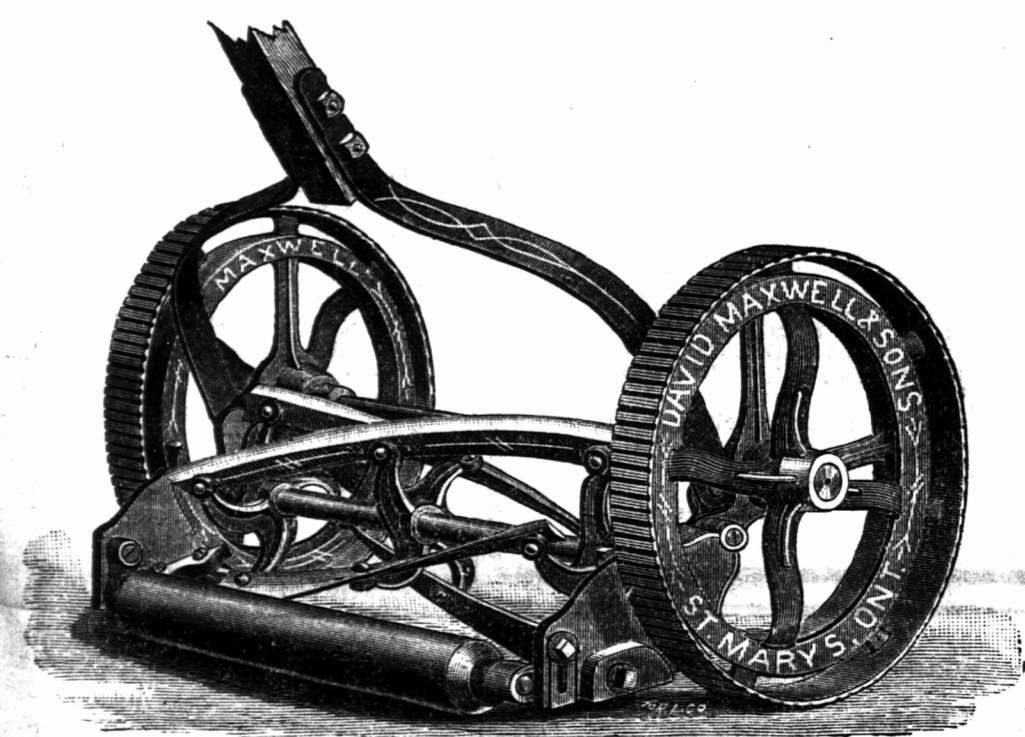

BISHOP COURTNEY

Mission to Australia an Important One.

THE AMERICAN PRESS

Speak in Highest Terms and Refer to His Great Ability.

The Boston Transcript which takes a keen interest in Canadian affairs makes the following reference to His Lordship Bishop Courtney's mission to Australia: "Bishop Courtney of Nova Scotia, who is so well known to the people of Boston, leaves his Diocese for Australia to-day upon an important mission. In the early part of this year the Archbishop of Rupert's Land, Primate of all Canada, wrote to Dr. Courtney, saying that he had received letters from the Archbishop of Sydney, Primate of Australia, and from the Bishop of Tasmania, asking him to send a representative to a great gathering of the Church of England in Australia, which will take place in Sydney in the latter part of August next, when their General synod will be held, the jubilee of missions and the last year of the century celebrated, and possibly two new dioceses created; and that he (the Archbishop of Rupert's Land) had nominated Dr. Courtney as such representative of the Church of England in Canada.

"After taking the counsel and advice of his executive committee the Bishop of Nova Scotia accepted the nomination. At its session in April last the Synod of management of the Domestic and Foreign Missions passed the following resolution: 'That the Board respectfully ask the most reverend, the Archbishop, to furnish the Bishop of Nova Scotia with an official letter commending him to the Bishop of Tokyo and to the clergy in the Canadian mission in Japan, requesting that the most favorable opportunity may be afforded him of visiting and studying every feature of the mission, with a view to bringing back with him a personal acquaintance with the position and work of each missionary on the staff, for the advantage and guidance of the Board of Management in providing for the missionaries and promoting their work.'

"Nor is this all. The presiding Bishop of the Protestant Episcopal Church in America has asked Dr. Courtney to carry an official letter from the Bishop, conveying their fraternal greeting to the Church in Australia on the occasion of this important gathering. We have no doubt that Dr. Courtney will discharge rightly and ably the duty laid upon him, that he will speak and act in a manner worthy of this great embassy, doing his part towards drawing closer the bonds which unite the great Anglican communion that knows no limit of time or place, and laying a spiritual cable in the Pacific Ocean through which messages of love and sympathy may pass to and from Australia, Japan and the United States of America."
