Cows For Alfalfa Hay (Special To The Guardian) REGINA, March 31.—Harking back to the days of barter, when commodities of life were exchanged without money, farmers of Moosejaw district together with the Farmers' Cooperative Association of Brooks, Alta., have solved at last the existing problem of overproduction. By an arrangement between the Milk Producers Association of Moosejaw and the Alberta body, selected dairy cows are now being traded for their worth in alfalfa hay, a product for which the Alberta district is noted.
