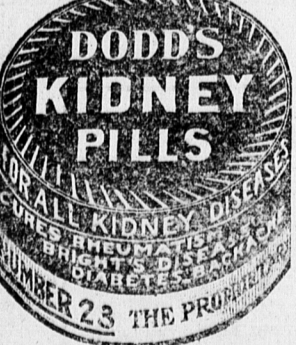

ONE BOY SHOOT ANOTHER.

REXTON, N. B., Sept. 27.—A shooting accident occurred at Main River, Saturday. Two young men, David Thompson, aged 17 years, and his companion were driving on a hay rack, and had a loaded gun with them. One of the young lads took the gun, not knowing it was loaded, and it accidentally discharged, the bullet entering Thompson's mouth. The young man was brought to town and received medical attention. He is doing as well as could be expected.

CHICAGO, Sept. 27.—Wm. J. Boerner, Organizer of Typographical Union 16 Samuel Olsen, Union Printer, were held for Grand Jury charged with the instigation of murder of Bush Benson, a non-union printer on Jan. 16th, 1911. The men were held as a result of the testimony in the Municipal Court of John Daly, former pugilist, who said he had been hired by Boerner and Olsen to "do up" Benson. He testified he had been given \$50 and that he had employed Samuel Cassidy, former Organizer of the Union, for \$10 to commit the assault, which resulted in Benson's death. Cassidy, was in court and admitted striking the fatal blows.

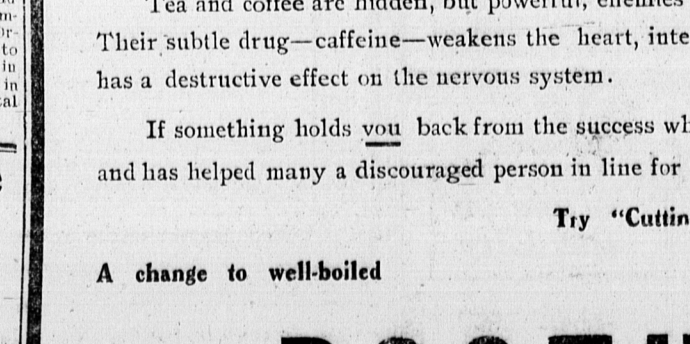
