That Body of Ours

WE MUST RELAX

A business man, in his fifties, awoke one morning and found that his right arm was numb—powerless. As he had a habit of lying with his right arm under his head this did not worry him. To his amazement and horror he found that his right leg was also numb and powerless. He thought he had a stroke of paralysis although his mind was clear and he was able to reach for the telephone with his left hand and call up his physician. He thus had not gone unconscious and had not lost his power of speech despite the paralysis of his right arm and leg.

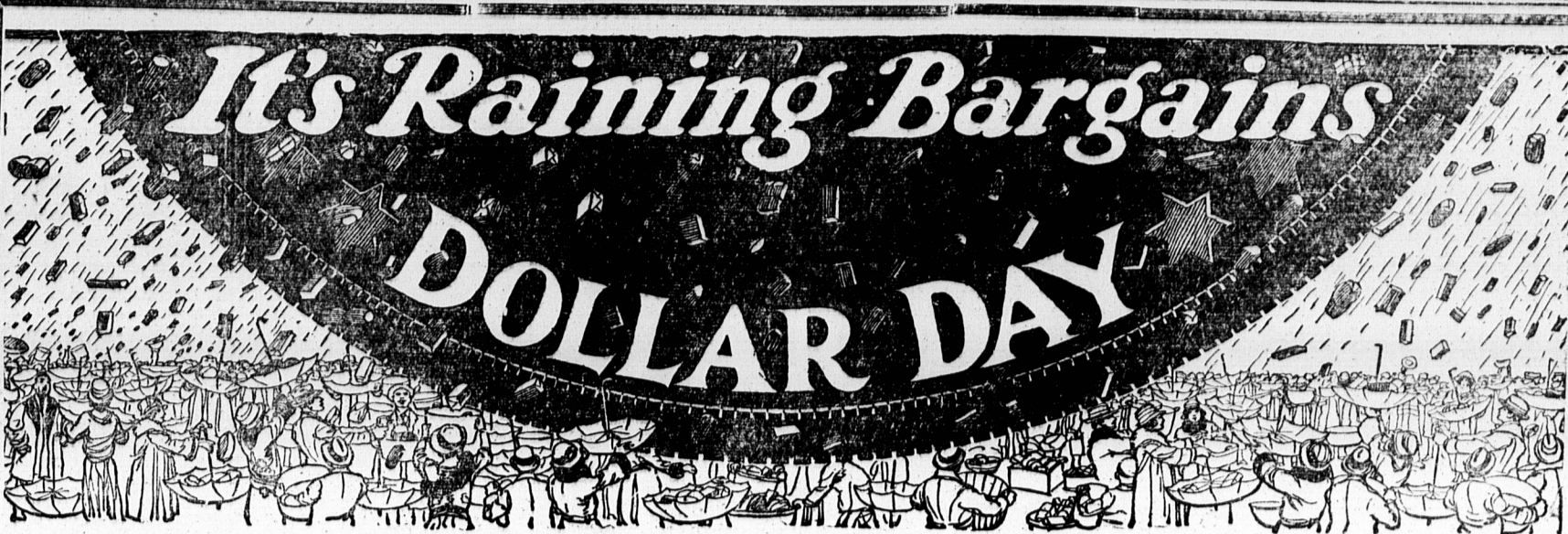
On the arrival of the physician it was found that his blood pressure was somewhat high—160—whereas his usual blood pressure was 135. A thorough examination revealed no heart trouble, urine normal and the blood test was negative.

As he had been working hard mentally, his physician advised rest in bed for a couple of weeks and that he thereafter learn to keep as relaxed as possible—exciting emotions, thrilling movies, keen bridge games, and all worries about business must be avoided.

The physician stated that just as the emotions can cause a spasm of the vessels supplying the heart muscle, the stomach or the intestine; so can hard mental work, worry or anxiety cause a spasm of the blood vessels of the brain and, for a short period of time, shut off the circulation of blood to parts that supply the nerve energy to certain parts of the body—arm, leg—thus causing numbness and powerlessness.

Investigation showed that this man was "tensed" all the time—at his business, at church, at the theatre or even when he was simply reading the daily newspaper. He was of course advised by his physician to relax more, to take things easier, to take longer week-end vacations and to get more sleep.

Now this may mean work—trying to relax—to many of us, but it must be done if we would save wear and tear on the nervous system—rapid heart beat, increased blood pressure, tensed muscles which soon tire us, lessening of the flow of the digestive juices, and sleeplessness.

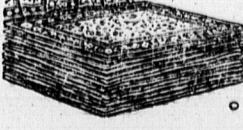
