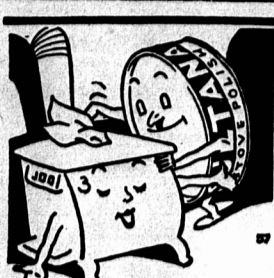

Premier's Speech On Draft Address

Several excerpts from Premier Campbell's speech on the Draft Address in the Legislature on Wednesday appeared in yesterday's Guardian. Following is a summary of his remarks on other subjects.

Dehydration Plant It was this which had decided the Government to take up the vegetable dehydration plant project. The two-fold purpose was to provide the supply of commodities which are needed for war purposes, and also provide a basis for an industry which should be suitable and beneficial to the Province not only at the present time but after the war.

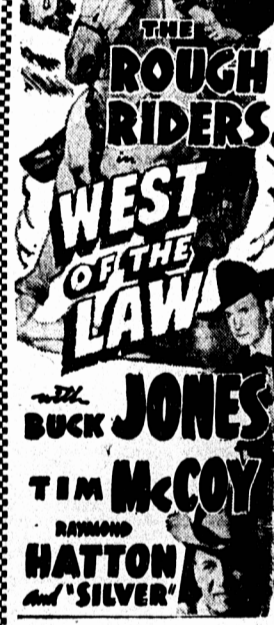
