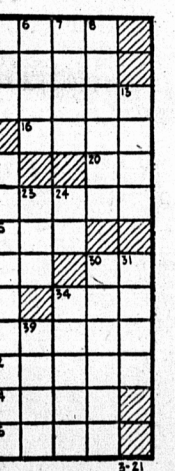
Certain tiled chapel floors from the original building of the Abbey Church of St. Denis, in France are still in existence, after more than 800 years.
