**THE ELECTIONS TOMORROW.**

The provincial elections take place tomorrow, which may be expected to be a busy day throughout the Island. The campaign has been quite a brisk one and many meetings have been held jointly or separately by the opposing candidates. Our system of small electoral divisions give the electors the advantage of a personal acquaintance, in most cases at least, with the candidates they are asked to support. In other Provinces, where the smallest electoral division outside the towns and cities is a riding or a county, and many times the area of our Island electoral districts, this advantage is not so fully enjoyed. With us the personal character, standing and repute of the candidates are generally known to those who vote. No mistake can be made in voting for capable, sober honest, wide-awake, progressive and public spirited candidates who are known to be ready to support and help enforce every good law now on the statute book. As for the rest we can only enjoin upon our readers the importance of repressing all attempts at corruption, all use of whiskey and bribes. Let us have, as far as possible an honest and pure election. This is of vastly more importance than any party triumph.

**203 METRE HILL.**

Two Hundred and Three Metre Hill, of whose capture by the Japanese frequent mention has been made of late in our war despatches, takes its name from its height. It is marked in various war maps as 203 feet high, which is something more than 203 metres, the metre being 39.37 inches. The famous hill lies almost due east of Port Arthur city and harbor which it commands and south of the famous Keekwan and Rihlung forts. The 'wagon road from Dalny enters the city along a valley between the hill and the Keekwan forts. The hill is the highest eminence marked on the maps within the principal chain of fortresses surrounding Port Arthur. All the forts above named lie to the eastward of the railway, which enters the city from the northward, and it is in the east quarter that the heavy fighting of some weeks past has taken place.

The Patriot makes the pleasing announcement that instructions have been received to proceed at once with the extension of the rails to the Plant Line Wharf.

The members of the City Council, who were all apparently committed to civic ownership of an electric lighting plant at the time of their election must all be fully aware of how much more efficient and satisfactory the civic management of the water and sewerage services has been than the company management of the street lighting.

Very cordial and pleasing was the reception accorded to Bishop Worrell at St. Paul's schoolroom last evening, in which the Lieutenant Governor, the Mayor and Council and cerymen of various religious bodies attended. Bishop Worrell was evidently gratified with the heartiness of the welcome which represented so many and such varied interests, and we believe those present were much pleased to spend a social hour with a church dignitary who is so affable and pleasant to meet. The Rector, and membership of St. Paul's spared no pains to make the occasion most agreeable to all who attended.

Some published correspondence between Premier Peters with Sir Wilfrid Laurier, Premiers Ross, Parent, Murray, Tweedie, the Minister of Marine and others, goes to show that the Island claim for its share in the fishery award, and the claims of the various provinces for increased subsidies all around are being pressed. Most of the letters bear date in November last passed. All will join in the hope, which if long deferred is not yet dead, that the Provinces may in the future be given a larger share than they have heretofore enjoyed of the superabundant revenues raised by federal taxation, and which so far exceed what was contemplated at the time the Provinces were united.
