To the evening many people attended at Victoria Park, where the Ambulance Corps, the "body snatchers" are drilling with their ambulances, and the other men of the various corps, not detailed for duty, are amusing themselves at various sports. After tea, however, most of the men came to town, for they soon develop a trait that is not peculiar alone to their brothers of the regular army—namely, fondness for female society.

The total strength of the camp establishment is as follows: Staff—Lt. Col. Moore, 5 officers, and 10 N. C. Officers and men.

Light Horse—Captain J. A. MacDonald, 7 officers, 8 N. C. officers, 73 men, 3 vehicles, and 80 horses.

4th Regiment Artillery—Major Leslie, 6 officers, 10 N. C. officers and 91 men.

82d Regiment—Lt. Col. Stewart, 30 officers, 41 N. C. officers and 303 men, including 23 in the band.

The Light Horse are being well drilled. It is rather a pity that their drill ground is so far from the city centre; but doubtless citizens will have an opportunity of seeing the splendid corps manoeuvre at Victoria Park sometime this week.
