### Drive Said To Be Going Well To Date

#### Many Large Subscriptions Already In; Small Buyers Must Get Behind Loan To Put It Over Top.

A total of \$691,250 has been subscribed to the Fourth Victory Loan in the first three days of the campaign, it was announced last night. Officials at Provincial headquarters were enthusiastic and said the support to date has been marvellous.

The Province's objective is \$2,500,000 and the subscriptions now represent more than 27 1-2 per cent of that amount.

However, it was pointed out that a number of large subscriptions have already been received. For the loan to be a success the smaller buyers must give their support. Reports from salesmen, however, indicate that the public is responding well.

By districts the subscriptions to date are: Charlottetown, \$162,150; Queen's County outside Charlottetown, \$50,450; Summerside, \$350,850; balance of Prince County, \$62,600; King's County, \$65,200.

#### Senator MacArthur Favors Causeway

MONCTON, N.B., April 28—(CP)—A causeway to connect Prince Edward Island with New Brunswick was advocated by Senator Greelman MacArthur, Summerside, P.E.I., in an interview tonight while enroute from Boston to his home.


Senator MacArthur said he was inquiring into the effectiveness of a 28-mile causeway in Norway. Cost of a similar one, eight or nine miles long, across Northumberland Strait had been estimated at \$40,000,000. He stated this would be more feasible than a tunnel.

Suggestion that a causeway be built during wartime, with proceeds from war savings the labor was made by Senator MacArthur. Meanwhile an ice-breaking passenger ferry should be built and placed in the Cape Tormentine-Borden route, he said.
