OTTAWA, July 13.—W. B. MacKenzie, chief engineer of the I.C.R., gave evidence before the public accounts committee with reference to the agreement made with E. A. Wallberg for the Moncton locomotive car shops. The agreement was a verbal one and was made at the time the ground around the shops was flooded and had to be drained off immediately. Mr. MacKenzie, in a case of emergency, said he acted on his own authority in asking Wallberg to undertake the work.
