OTTAWA, Feb. 14—(CP)—Canada had a surplus of \$261,200,000 on foreign trade with all countries in 1949, the Bureau of Statistics reported today.

That compared with a surplus of \$473,100,000 in 1948.

There was a surplus of \$401,800,000 in trade with the United Kingdom and a deficit of \$427,800,000 in trade with the United States.

Total imports were \$2,761,200,000 and exports were \$2,938,000,000.

The increase in the deficit with the U.S. accounted for nearly two-thirds of the drop in the overall surplus, the Bureau said.

Imports from the United States were the highest in history. They compared with \$2,636,900,000 in 1948 and were nearly four times larger than the 1935-39 average.

The exports were down from the 1948 record total of \$3,075,400,000. In addition, imported foreign goods worth \$29,500,000 were re-exported, further increasing the total exports.

Each of the first 10 months of the year resulted in deficits. But in November, there was a surplus of \$10,900,000, followed by a surplus of \$10,700,000 in December.

Canada had a surplus of \$401,800,000 with Britain, more than \$11,000,000 higher than in 1948. Imports from Britain were \$307,400,000, the highest in history, and exports were \$705,000,000, about \$18,000,000 higher than in 1948.

Exports to the U.S. were \$1,503,500,000, an all-time record total and \$2,500,000 higher than in 1948. Imports were \$1,951,000,000, about \$146,000,000 higher than in 1948.

The decline in the export total to all countries was attributed in lower exports to dollar-short European countries.

The increase in imports occurred despite a marked drop in the value of imports during the last half of the year. Imports were higher from the U.S., the United Kingdom, the British West Indies and Europe but were lower from Latin America, and other Commonwealth countries.

The biggest increase came in imports of iron and steel products. The value of imports in this group rose to \$891,600,000 in 1949 compared with \$782,300,000.

Empire Life Reports Noteworthy Progress

KINGSTON, Ont., Feb. 13—“Company progress in 1949 was noteworthy in several important respects,” stated C. P. Fell, President, at the annual meeting of the Empire Life Insurance Company on Saturday. “Realized surplus on insurance account was the largest in the company's history, permitting more liberal provision to be made for participating policy-holders. The favorable mortality experience of the past year contributed substantially to this result and reflects the sound and progressive nature of the Company's growth.”

“Sales of new insurance likewise, in Canada and the British West Indies established a new high record of business in force—\$89,211,956 at December 31st, 1949, owned by 49,532 policyholders. Insurance in force has more than doubled in the past 10 years. Assets stand at a new record total of \$17,993,394.”

“In the aggregate the market value of the company's bonds and stocks substantially exceeded the value recorded in the balance sheet. It will be noted,” Mr. Fell continued, “that the distribution of securities by types has undergone a significant shift during the past year. During war years investment opportunities were limited principally to government bonds at low interest rates. Life insurance companies subscribed generously to this type of investment to the exclusion of most others. The result in many cases was a portfolio too heavy with low interest bearing government bonds. This situation necessitated the company taking advantage of the broader investment opportunities in more recent years which included residential mortgages and corporate securities at higher yield rates. In all investment transactions, safety of principal was the predominant consideration.”

A dividend of 4 per cent was declared on the capital stock, payable 1st March 1950 to shareholders of record 1st February, 1950.
