BIG FIRE AT BRUSSELS.

BRUSSELS, Aug. 15—The White City of the World's Fair, as the Belgians have called their 1910 exposition, is a mass of flames and smouldering ruins. The loss in the exposition fire is estimated at \$100,000,000. A spark falling into inflammable material in the telegraph building burst up into flames, which driven by a high wind swept rapidly in all directions. Soon the Belgian, English and French sections were destroyed. Firemen and a detachment of soldiers called quickly on the scene, found themselves baffled by a veritable gale, which carried the burning embers to all parts of the grounds.

FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE DEAD.

LONDON, Aug. 15—Florence Nightingale, the famous nurse of the Crimean war, and the only woman who ever received the Order of Merit, died yesterday at her London home. Although an invalid for a long time, rarely leaving her room, her death was somewhat unexpected.

A week ago she was quite ill, but improved and on Friday was cheerful. During the night alarming symptoms developed and she gradually sank.

Her funeral will be as quiet as possible, in accordance with her wishes. On May 12th last she celebrated her ninety-fifth birthday and was the recipient of a congratulatory message from King George.

In the early part of her life she inspected schools and hospitals in England and afterwards in all parts of Europe and finally decided to become a hospital nurse. She was especially celebrated for her noble service at Scutari during the Crimean War, 1854-56. Her health suffered severely from the continued strain and her unselfish devotion.

At the close of the war she was enabled by a testimonial fund to found an institution for the training of nurses, the Nightingale Home at St. Thomas Hospital. She was also the means of calling attention to the unsanitary condition of camp hospitals, etc.

LOW RATES TO TORONTO EXHIBITION.

Rush of Travel Expected from Maritime Provinces.

Maritime Province people will feel a keen interest this year in the Canadian National Exhibition at Toronto, which will be held from August 27th to Sept. 12th. This great annual fair will have many new features and special attractions that will surpass all previous efforts. The Toronto Exhibition is becoming a greater attraction each year. The daily attendance averages about 60,000, and on special days, such as Labor Day, as many as 130,000 persons have passed through the turn stiles. Beautifully situated on the shores of Lake Ontario, the park-like grounds are beautifully kept and when thronged with people present an animated scene. Apart from the Exhibition, a visit to Toronto at this season is always enjoyable. The very low rates that prevail on the Intercolonial Railway will give to many the opportunity to make this round trip at very reasonable expense. Round trip tickets will be issued August 25, 27, 29, 30, 31, and on Sept. 7 and 8, at first class one way fare. On August 26 and September 1 and 6, the rate is still more reasonable, \$19.85 being the round trip from this city. All Intercolonial Railway Montreal trains arrive at and depart from the Bonaventure Union Station, and it is here that connections are made with the trains of the Grand Trunk Railway. Those travelling by the Ocean Limited are enabled to connect with the Grand Trunk International Limited departing for Toronto at 9.00 a. m., the fastest express train between Montreal and Toronto, making the run between these two cities in daylight, arriving at 4.30 p. m., and saving hours of time. Billing's black gelding Uhlán, today trotted a new world's record today by trotting a mile at North Randall track without wind shield in 1.58 3/4, beating Lou Dillon's record by 2 1/2 seconds, and coming within 1/4 of a second of equalling the record made by her with a wind shield on October 24th, 1905, when she trotted a mile at Memphis in 1.58 1/4.

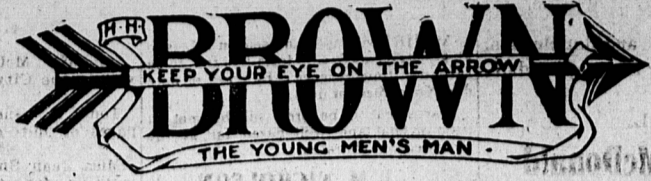
NEGRO LYNCHED FOR ENTERING GIRLS' ROOM.
