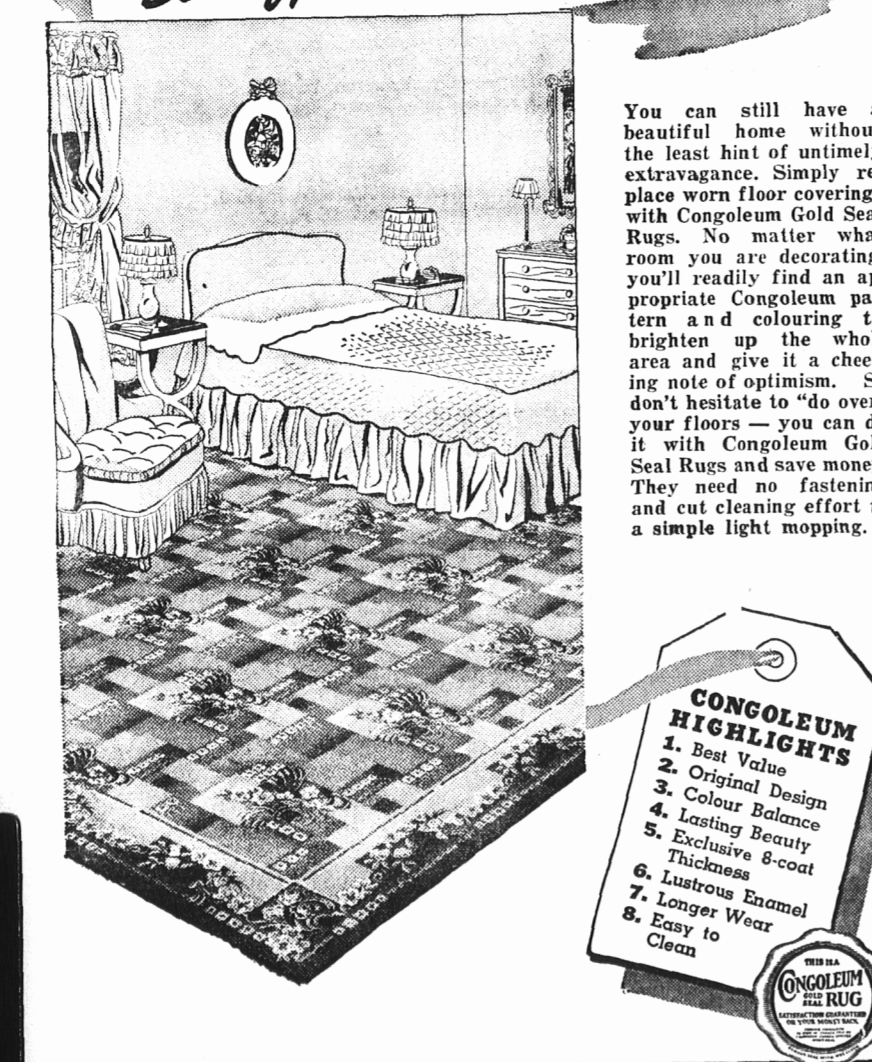

OLIVER C. LEPAGE entered the LePage home and took from their midst the father, Mr. Oliver C. LePage, Mr. LePage was a hard working successful farmer. Not being extremely fond of school days he took charge of his father's farm at the early age of fourteen years, his father being a sea captain. After working hard on his father's farm for a few years he obtained the old Coles property which is a short distance from the LePage homestead. Starting with a very small capital he built up one of the finest properties on Prince Edward Island, having erected all new buildings. He was very proud of the home he built up. After returning from a trip to his usual remark "I have seen yet" and to him it was, "It may truly be said that he respected the fruit of his labour. Not only was he an ambitious well doing farmer, but he was also keenly interested in every movement for the betterment of the people of this Province. He was an elder of the Presbyterian, now United Church, for forty years. He was an outstanding director of the New Glasgow Dairy Factory for many years, and filled many other positions both in social and business life.

Included were acting Sqdn. Ldr. Norman Bretz of Toronto and Lloyd Chadburn of Aurora, Ont. and Montreal, P.E.I. Wm. H. Baldwin of Ottawa, P.E.I. Lt. Reginald Lane of Victoria, B.C. Lt. Herbert Swetman of Montreal, P.E.I. Sgt. John D. Dickson of King's County N.B. Pte. Bernard L. Schaumburg of Verdwood, Sask. Pte. Guy P. A. Yates of Toledo, Ont. and Sgt. Ronald George Bell of Kelowna, B.C. In addition, the D.F.C. was awarded to Wing Cmdr. Michael Evelyn Pollard, who was educated in Montreal and is a former trooper in the 11th Duke of York's Royal Canadian Hussars, and acting Pte. Lt. Albert Lambert, a native of Bristol, Eng., whose home now is in Saint John, N.B. and who flies in the R.C. A.F. Pollard hails from Crofton, Eng.
