**A PROVINCIAL EXHIBITION.**

Now that the Legislature is again in session and estimates are being made for the public services of the year, we desire to present to our representatives the claims for a grant for an inter-provincial Exhibition to be held in Charlottetown next autumn. It seems almost unnecessary to repeat the arguments in favor of such a display of our farm, dairy and orchard products and stock. The exhibition has become a recognised institution of all civilized countries. It is the best form of advertising what we produce and have to sell in the markets of the world, and without judicious advertising in these days no business can be successful. An Exhibition is to our agricultural interests what the show window is to the merchant, the attractive display which tempts the customer first to admire and then to purchase.

It is also much more than this. It is a great educational institution in which every farmer, stock-raiser, dairyman or fruit-grower may learn from his neighbor, his rival and competitor the latest and best points of advancement and progress in his particular line of production. And while it teaches, it stimulates. Competition is said to be the life of trade, and this is true, but it is equally true that competition is the life of all productive industry. We need the educational influence and the energising effect of competition to enable us to make the best use of our opportunities, to keep pace with our neighbors in the sister Provinces and in order that we may be able to profitably compete with all comers in the markets of the world.

Already we have gained some points in the march of advancement. In proportion to area and population the Island is easily first in co-operative dairying among the Provinces of Canada. It is within our reach to yet be first in live stock and in fruit growing. Our prizes in live stock at the St. John and Halifax exhibitions have been numerous in proportion to the number of exhibitors, while our display of fruits last year quite eclipsed the best that Nova Scotia or New Brunswick could put forward. The capabilities of the Island for producing fruit has surprised alike ourselves and our neighbors and has opened up an avenue for a new and profitable industry that will greatly increase the productiveness and profit of those who live from the produce of the soil.

Clearly this is not the time for the Island to drop out of the race, as we must do if no Exhibition is to be held. For if we have no Exhibition our farmers, dairymen, stock-raisers and fruit-growers will be shut out of the Exhibitions and competitions in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. The time is rather one in which to strain every nerve to hold the advantages we have gained, press to the front and capture the first position among the Maritime Provinces. The Exhibitions of the past have been exceedingly valuable in making the Island and its products favorably known. They have been valuable to our producers for the handsome and numerous sales they have been able to

make on the ground, wherever they have competed, at home or in the sister Provinces across the straits. We cannot afford to forfeit these advantages and it becomes evident that we must suffer loss in many ways unless an Exhibition is held during the coming autumn.

It is equally obvious that no system of county fairs or exhibitions such as have been sometimes proposed can ever take the place of one Exhibition for the entire Province. Such fairs would be local in their character, held for one day, which if stormy would make it a failure. It would not attract visitors or competition from outside except to a limited extent. Nor is it at present practicable to hold a Provincial Exhibition outside of Charlottetown. It would be practicable, if say, Summerside or Souris were equipped for the purpose with a suitable building, grounds, race-track and stock-sheds which would cost a good deal of money in the first place and would require time to erect and prepare. It is in no sectional or selfish spirit that we present the claims of Charlottetown in this matter. This happens to be the most central position, the largest centre of population which the Island affords, conveniently accessible by rail and steamer and fully equipped for all the purposes of an Exhibition on a large scale. For all these reasons and for many others that could be given we trust that the Government and Legislature will take the most favorable view of the proposal to repeat this year the Inter-Provincial Fair which last year proved so highly successful.

The French Shore question remains a perplexing one in Newfoundland and it seems a great pity that a settlement of some more satisfactory sort could not be arrived at between Great Britain and France. The privileges which the old treaty secured to French fishermen on the shore in question are of much less value to France than a source of annoyance and loss to the Newfoundlander, but so far British diplomacy has been unequal to effecting a settlement. Some years ago a temporary arrangement was effected for one year, commonly known as a *modus vivendi*, which received the sanction of the Newfoundland Legislature in the hope that before the end of the year a full settlement would be reached. Such was not the case and at the end of the year Newfoundland was asked to extend the *modus vivendi*. That was reluctantly done. The people were naturally impatient when the Legislature was again asked for a renewal this year and the measure has narrowly escaped defeat, being only carried through the Upper House by the casting vote of the presiding officer. Next year a further extension if asked for may be refused.
