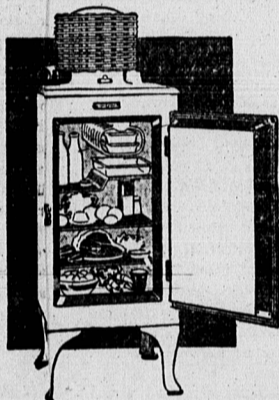

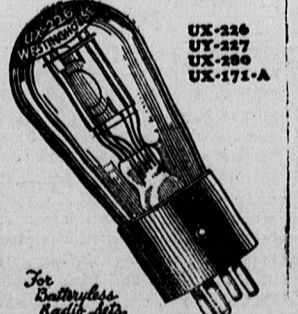

Tomatoes When all danger of frost is past, the main planting of tomatoes may be set out. Generally speaking, these should be staked, particularly in the smaller garden where early fruit is wanted. The staked plants are a little more care but when grown in this way they require less room, will bear earlier and the fruit will be cleaner than if the vines are allowed to sprawl on the ground. Inch square, six foot stakes should be used, and these should be driven about ten or twelve inches into the soil before the plants are set out. The stakes can be placed at two feet intervals each way. Select stinky plants and set about a couple of inches away from the stake. When transplanting, it is advisable to put a pinch of nitrate of soda around each plant to give it an early start, and apply another dose of this fertilizer, about a quarter of a teaspoonful per plant, in a couple of weeks. Nip off all side buds, allowing the main stem only to grow and tying this loosely to the stake at intervals of a foot with raffia or soft twine. Granada . . . . . 13.00 13.00.
