THE GUARDIAN'S attention has been directed to a very spiteful and malicious personal attack upon Hon. We do not think that the letter will at all injuriously affect Mr. Rogers in his chances of election or in the estimation of those who know him. Nor can it help the Opposition cause in any way. The better class of Conservatives and Liberals alike will join with us in the conclusion that the letter in question had better not have been published.

We make no insinuations with regard to the Examiner, though it yesterday repeated its charge of "false insinuations." We quoted its own words affirming the uselessness of all prohibitory laws.
