CANADIAN ENGINEER
TO BUILD WONDERFUL AERIAL RY.

MONTREAL, Oct. 24.—Lieut. Col. A. C. de L. Joly de Lotbiniere, the well-known Canadian military engineer, and son of Sir Henri de Lotbiniere, ex-Lieut. Governor of Quebec, has planned a remarkable aerial railway across the Himalaya mountains. Col. de Lotbiniere, who has been giving his services to the Kashmir Government, and is now State Engineer, proposes, by an aerial line, 75 miles long, to join the beautiful and famous "Val of Kashmir" with the plains of the Punjab in Northern India. The railway will be begun next spring, according to a report just received by the State Department at Washington, from the United States

REPAIRING BELL TOWER.—It has been found that the roof of the clock and bell tower of the Court House Charlottetown, is leaking and at present workmen are engaged in effecting the repairs necessary to render it water-tight again.

PHILADELPHIA, PA., Oct. 27.—Thomas Dolan, who has been recognized for many years as a leader among Philadelphia's "captains of industry," entered upon his 80th year today. In connection with the recent enactment of an income tax measure by Congress, the fact is recalled that Mr. Dolan is the solitary survivor among thirty-six Philadelphians who were assessed as having incomes of \$100,000 or more when the Civil War income tax was passed in 1864.

POULTRY MEETINGS.—Mr. T. A. Benson, Poultry Expert, accompanied by Mr. Russel Fee of Ottawa, has been holding a series of meetings at points where co-operative Egg Circles are established; the subjects taken up at these meetings being crate fattening of poultry and winter egg production. At the conclusion of each of Mr. Benson's addresses, Mr. Fee who is an expert in the art of egg candling, has given interesting demonstrations. Great care has been taken to have on hand, eggs showing various descriptions and stages of deterioration, the nature and causes of which were in each case very explicitly explained. The question of how these heavy losses can be avoided or at least very greatly minimized was also taken up, and such demonstrations as these should be of almost inestimable value to the egg industry of our Province. Unfortunately on account of Mr. Benson's illness, meetings arranged for last week had to be postponed, but it is hoped that he will be able to continue the series of meetings in a few days. In the meantime Mr. Fee has been giving special instruction in candling at several points to those connected with the working of the egg circles.
