GRAND LODGE

I. O. O. F. of the Maritime Provinces.

ALL ARRANGEMENTS

Have Been Completed and The First Session Will be on Aug. 8.

COUN. J. F. Whear and Mr. D. R. McLennan leave this morning for Halifax to attend I. O. O. F. meeting there. Messrs James Waddell, A. W. Mitchell, Philip Bridges and George Waller will also attend. Mrs. Waller and McLennan are also entitled to attend meetings of both Encampment and Grand Lodge, the others the Grand Lodge only. Grand Encampment meeting on Tuesday, Grand Lodge on Wednesday and Thursday.

The executive committee of the special committee of the Grand Lodge, I. O. O. F., of the Maritime Provinces, have completed all arrangements, and the Grand Lodge will have its opening session on August 8th. It was decided last year that this year's session should be held at Sydney, but owing to the absence of sufficient accommodation there it was decided a few months ago that Halifax should get the meeting, to which there will be about two hundred and fifty delegates.

The Grand Encampment will open at Oddfellows' Temple on Tuesday morning, Aug. 7th, and during the afternoon the Halifax Encampment members will entertain their visiting brethren to an excursion on the harbor.

Mizpah Lodge, No. 5, I. O. O. F., D. R., are arranging (subject to the Grand Encampment having completed its business without an evening session) to exemplify the Rebekah degree on the evening of the 7th, to which all visiting Rebekans will be cordially welcome. Any representatives who have never had the degree, and reside in a county where there is no degree lodge, would be eligible to join on that occasion. Those who purpose doing so should apply at once to the secretary of the committee, who will arrange to supply application forms and all necessary information. After the degree is conferred (about 9 p. m) the meeting will be open to a complimentary reception tendered to the delegates of the Grand lodge generally and their lady friends who accompany them.

Members of the reception committee will be in attendance on the arrival of all trains and steamers to welcome and direct delegates.

On Wednesday morning, at 11 the first session of the Grand Lodge will open at the Temple, where all the sessions will be held, the Grand Master presiding.

It is the intention to have the delegates shown at the Temple on Wednesday evening, Halifax and Dartmouth lodges doing the secret work of the Order, presenting the initiatory and second degrees.

It is likely that all of Thursday's session will be taken up for consideration of the new constitution for the Order, as proposed, and the annual meeting is expected to close with Thursday night's session.

The Sovereign Grand Lodge of America is to meet at Richmond, Virginia, September 2nd, and the two delegates from Encampment and two from the Grand Lodge are to be elected at the meetings here.

The executive of the special committee on reception of Grand Lodge consists of Ald. Rogers (chairman), A. F. Messervey (secretary), C. W. Waterfield and Donald A. Ross.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

And Its Attractions to Tourists.

Prince Edward Island's summer climate is delightful, and the scenery is beautiful and quietly picturesque. Surrounded by the Gulf of St. Lawrence, it enjoys all the coolness of the sea breeze, and the advantages that can only be derived from sea bathing, at about 65 degrees.

Charlottetown has over 12,000 inhabitants, and is the capital. It has many great retail stores, besides a large wholesale trade. It has a Gas Light and Power Company, two Electric Light plants, and a street railway in embryo. It has a first class water works and sewerage system. It is famed for its wide and shaded streets its many pleasant drives, the principal of which is the new Park Boulevard, its attractive surroundings, pure water, and clear, cool and bracing air. It is widely known as one of the healthiest cities in Canada. It has two hospitals, many churches and a large and elegant new Opera house. It also has several fine public buildings and a market which is one of the chief sources of the citizens' here. It has one of the largest and best equipped pork-packing establishments in the Dominion. On its west side is Victoria Park—a favorite summer resort—while on the east are the magnificent new Exhibition Buildings and Driving Park. Chief among its public squares is Queen Square in the centre of the city, beautifully laid out with blooming plants of every description, fountains, and well arranged walks, and enlivened with a band of music during the summer evenings. The rural scenery in the vicinity of Charlottetown is charming, and horses for driving are abundant at very low prices. Boats can also be hired, and steamers run regularly on the bays and rivers, affording most pleasant excursions. The principal hotels are Davies, Queen, and Revere.

Summerside has about 3000 inhabitants. It is situated on beautiful Bedeque Bay. It has the largest and finest departmental store in the Maritime Provinces, besides having other large retail stores. It has an Electric Light Plant, and a water works system and sewerage are being agitated for. The hotels are—Clifton, Queen, Russ Strathcona and Campbell.

Georgetown and Souris have a population of about 1,000 each. In the former are the Aitken, and Tapper hotels and in Souris the Sea View.

At Cape Traverse, a very pleasant summer resort, is the Landsdowne hotel; in Alberton, the Albion Terrace and Wisney; in Tignish the Railway and Bellevue; in Kensington, Clark's and Commercial; in Montague, McDonald; and in Mount Stewart, Clark's and Manson's.

The following hotels open for the summer season: At Hampton, Pleasant View; at Stanhope, Mutch's and Cliff; at Brackley Point, Shaw's; at Rustico, Seaside; at Malpeque, North Shore; at Tracadie Beach, Acadia; at Alberton, Seaforth; and at Powna, Florida.

In addition to those already mentioned there are other towns and villages in the Province with hotel accommodation, while many farm houses prepare for the reception of tourists. The rivers and streams teem with trout, the bays with mackerel, while game of every description bounds.

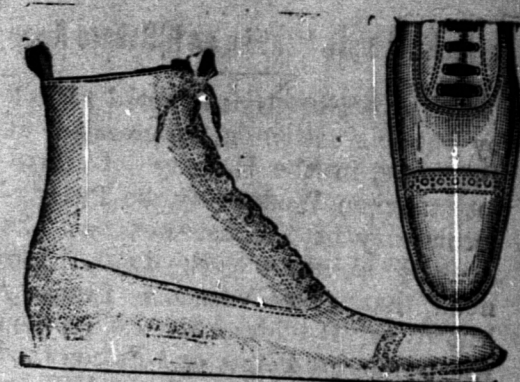

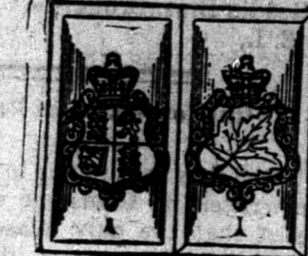
