Stage Is Most Lucrative of Arts, Declares Ziegfeld Follies Star



RUTH ETTING

Ruth Etting, Artist and Actress, Finds Stage a Gold Mine

New York City.—The stage is the only one of the arts that pays the landlord and the musician as well as the artist's yearning for fame and a creative outlet.

Ruth Etting, singer, dancer, song writer, star in the new Ziegfeld Follies, speaks with the confidence that comes with the knowledge of a four figure a week contract at hand.

"A painter may paint masterpieces, a musician may be a second Mozart, but the chances are great that the masterpiece will not be discovered until after the painter is buried, and the musician money never have enough to hire a hall," declares Miss Etting. "This is especially true when the artist happens to be a woman. A career on the stage, if the woman is truly talented, brings its reward, both monetary and artistic, while the woman is still young enough to enjoy that reward. The world of the theatre is a rapid moving world, and more or less faithful once it has placed the laurel wreath on a favorite. To a woman who makes good on the stage there are many profitable years in which she may earn further fame."

While the young actress who only a short time ago left her home in David City, Nebraska, is enthusiastic over the stage as a career for women, she warns the modern girl that she must be ready to meet the demands of the stage.

"Few artistic professions demand eyes much brain and brawn work."

"Perhaps that is the reason for the large salaries. In my own case, every song must be separately studied as each picture must be clear to the audience for both eyes and ears. I am singing a waltz ballad now 'Honolulu Moon' in which the composer has captured the music of the sea, not the angry, ominous, dashing of turbulent waves but the haunting melody of South Sea waters."

"I try to express a music that is the lullaby, the love song of an island people, the moaning, plainness of the sea that surrounds them."

"This is by no means easy and I worked for weeks before I got the desired effects."

"Stage life is glorious, thrilling, lucrative, but every thrill claims its quota of the hardest kind of mental and often physical endeavor. But I haven't one regret in my choice of professions."

maintained against its neighbor nations and the recent military exercises of United States troops in Nicaragua. To the limits of justice, the suggestions and requirements of a foreign government should be received with all courtesy. Courtesy is shown in deeds as well as in words. It has been defined as "kindness, complaisance, affability" and it should be exercised, not only between nations, but between neighbors and between the members of families.—to the limit of that which is just and right. St. Paul gave good advice when he wrote, "Be kindly affectioned one to another, with brotherly love in honour preferring one another." ***** Rejoice with them that do rejoice and weep with them that weep. Be of the same mind one towards another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate." That is the rule of courtesy; and if it were always followed there would be less bickering than there is among nations, parties, communities, churches, families and individuals of all women. I am, Sir, etc.

MEAN BUSINESS

Sir.—You do well to condemn in strong language the system of government patronage under which good men and women are turned out of office merely because they are supposed to belong to "the other party," and party heaters, without experience in the work to be done or ability to do it are given office in their stead. The encouragement of men of inferior ability to look for Government positions held by others is a mean business—mean on the part of the government and the acceptance of office held by other persons is mean on the part of the office-seekers. More than that it is evidently not for the good of the country. That a man or woman who cannot or does not do well the work required by the Government should be turned out of office is right and justifiable, but that a man or woman who can and does well the work required should be dismissed to make room for one who is inexperienced and incapable, is wrong and unjustifiable.

DOCTOR'S SCRIPTS

Sir.—The question of "Scripts" has been under serious consideration and may absorb considerable attention when amendments to the Act are before the Legislature. With me it has been the subject of much thought, and I have for a long time importuned to publicly express my views. I do not speak for the Alliance or anybody or class, these observations, whether acceptable or otherwise, are my own.

I do not approve of limiting unconditionally the number of scripts to be allotted to medical men. I doubt if a restriction which jeopardized a physician's proper treatment of his patient would be sustained in our courts. I would willingly endorse the total prohibition of the use of alcohol, even for medicinal use. This has been done in several States of the Union, but our Province is not yet sufficiently advanced in sentiment for this, and for some years at least, liquors for medicinal purposes must be tolerated.

My plan of operation would be—

(1) No limit of scripts to bona fide practitioners, except when restricted by law as a penalty for their mis-use.

(2) An increase in the severity of the penalty upon doctors for their unlawful use—and a strict enforcement of such punishment.

There are medical men amongst us, and the world over, of the highest standing who declare that alcohol is useless as a therapeutic agent. In the other hand we have medical authorities of the highest standing and sincerity who maintain it to be useful and necessary.

For our present purpose there is no need to discuss this phase.

Our medical men as a whole are amongst the most honorable of our citizens, and in their professional obligations sensitive, as they have a right to be, of the ethics of their calling. A few, and the number constitutes a limited percentage, are more or less lax in their sense of professional and public duty. It is only for these that legal restraint is needful, or should be designed.

MONTREAL, Jan. 23.—Dominion live stock branch—cattle receipts 83. With a comparatively light trading, active at higher prices. The average quality of the cattle was better. Four or five loads of good steers were sold at prices ranging from \$10.65 to \$11.25 and just medium quality light steers brought \$10.00. Top steers, mostly light, plain to medium kinds \$8.00 to \$8.30, and common \$7.00. Common cows and medium quality cows sold from \$5.50 to \$7.00. Good cows brought \$7.50 to \$8.00, and choice cows picked out \$8.50 with a few thin light ones at \$5.25.

Quotations—Butcher steers, good \$10.50 to \$11.25. Medium \$9.75 to \$10.25, common \$8.50 to \$9.50. Butcher heifers, good \$9.00 to \$10.00. Medium \$8.25 to \$8.75, common \$7.00 to \$8.00. Butcher cows, good \$7.50 to \$8.50, medium \$5.50 to \$7.00, canners \$3.25 to \$4.00, cutters \$4.00 to \$4.50, butcher bulls good \$7.00 to \$8.50, common \$5.25 to \$6.50.

Calf receipts 533. Good veals were in demand, and sold from \$15.50 to \$16.50. Small lots of very thin sucker calves brought \$10.50 to \$11.00. Grass calves sold from \$5.75 to \$6.10.

Quotations—Good veal \$11.50 to \$12.50; common \$10.25 to \$11.00; grass \$5.75 to \$6.10.

Sheep receipts 302. Lambs sold higher, a small lot fairly good lambs sold from \$11.25 to \$11.50, and one lot of twenty were picked out at \$12.00, common lambs and bucks sold together brought \$10.25 to \$11.00. Sheep \$4.00 to \$6.00.

Quotations—Ewes \$4.00 to \$6.00, good lambs \$12.00, common \$10.25 to \$11.00.

No receipts, 1, 847. There were not enough hogs on sale today to supply the demand and nearly all sales this morning were at \$9.00 flat and to local butchers. The bulk of the hogs received on the market last week-end and on the basis of \$9.25 with a bonus of \$1.00 per hog on selects and a cut of 50 cents per hog on shops and \$9.25 flat, about half the hogs were contracted for on the graded basis, some \$7.75 to \$8.00.

COOKERY COURSES FOR MEN

The declaration of Sir Robert Horne, speaking at the Glasgow College of Domestic Science recently, that a cookery class for poor and isolated single men should be established, has found many champions among leading educators of Europe. J. P. Thomas, of the Battersea Men's Institute of London, strongly favors the teaching of cooking to men, and his institution has established a men's class in the art. Among the pupils are both married and single men, and the instructor is a young woman. The entire duties of the kitchen are being taught, but stress is placed on the preparation of homely dishes. At each lesson the pupils' luncheons or suppers for the next day are prepared. The tuition is about 25 cents a term.
