LARGEST STOCK OWNER IN WORLD

The Flocks and Herds of Mexican Rancher Run Into The Millions - A Wonderful Ranch.

NEW YORK, Jan. 16.—If Gen. Luis Terrazas, of Chihuahua, was to be asked how many cattle he owns he probably could not tell within 100,000 of the exact number. He is the largest cattle, horse and mule owner in the world. He knows that he has grazing upon his several ranches something like 3,000,000 head of cattle, 5,000,000 head of horses, 1,000,000 head of mules and 1,000,000 head of sheep. These are approximate figures. His actual possessions of live stock may run a few hundred thousands above or below the total of these estimates. Gen. Terrazas nor his ranch foreman does not undertake to give anything like the exact number of cattle, horses, mules and sheep which graze upon Terrazas land.

Considerable attention was recently attracted in live stock circles of the United States by the sale of 75,000 sheep by Gen. Terrazas to a Colorado man. On top of this came the announcement that Gen. Terrazas had sold 20,000 head of cattle to American buyers. While these are large figures, as live stock sales go in the United States, they are only an infinitesimal part of the vast possessions of Gen. Terrazas.

TO PROTECT N.Y. FROM THE TRAMPS

NEW YORK, January 15.—With a view to protect the American metropolis from a lot of tramps and unemployed, which is reported on its way here, a conference of persons interested in the charitable care of the homeless was held recently at the United Charities Building, at which several plans were discussed.

Figures were presented at the meeting by the city lodging house superintendents showing that not only was the present lodging house which accommodates more than 300, full every night, a condition most unusual in itself, but that it had been necessary lately to use for the overflow the pier at the foot of East 26th street, where Commissioner Hibberd has his offices. From fifty to sixty men a night have been sent over there. On the night of December 16, when there was a snowstorm, the number sheltered in the pier rose to 315. The total overflow of the Municipal Lodging House from Dec. 1 to Dec. 23, is 2,353.

While these figures would seem to indicate an unusual amount of distress due to hard times, the statements made by the representatives of some of the societies engaged largely in house-to-house work among the poor showed apparently that the situation in New York city as regards the homeless is not bad, and it is the fear that the tramps and unemployed from all over the country are headed for the metropolis that a plan should be discussed to head off such an invasion before it is too late.

The plan suggested is that the department of charities should require some work from those it boards for the night. Their work would consist in shoveling snow, breaking up stone at Blackwell's Island, etc.

After discussing the scheme, the committee decided to adjourn. It will meet again in the event of destitute homeless class becomes abnormal.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 25, not reserved for the Dominion by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 year of age, to the extent of one-quarter section (60 a.) or more, less.

Applications for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Land Agency or Subagency for the district in which the land is situated, or by proxy, in the vicinity of his home. All land in the vicinity of his home and in the vicinity of his home must be cleared.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans:
(1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.
