TRAVELLED 200 MILES FOR A BIBLE

LONDON, Jan. 26.—The Rev. George Lowe, now a Bible Society agent at Johannesburg, South Africa, was for twenty years a missionary in that country. At a meeting held in Exeter Hall, London, he told the following story of two men making a journey of two hundred miles to get a Bible:

"Two men came to me from a people living two hundred miles still farther north. They had come to ask whether I could give them a complete Bible in the Zulu language. I said: 'How came you to have the Bible there?'"

The elder of them explained that they had gone to work twenty-five years before in one of the coast towns of South Africa, where he had been converted to God. The missionary had taught him to read, and when he went back to his people the missionary gave him a Bible. "That was twenty years before, and for twenty years he had been reading this Bible to his own people, and a number of them had already pronounced the words of healthiness and had accepted the truths of the Gospel. I shall never forget that interview as the old man, gray in the service of the Master, took his worn Bible out of the sheepskin case which he had made with his own hand. How tenderly he stroked its worn covers, and how the memory of the close companionship of twenty years rang out in his voice as he said: 'This missionary gave me the Bible that the old man, but this book lives. It is getting old now,' and then he tried to correct himself: 'No,' he said, 'It is getting worn; but the Bible never gets old.' Thank God that the Bible never grows old."


