N. B. PROHIBITION COMMISSION.

Before the New Brunswick Prohibition Commission visited this Province recently the Guardian intimated the belief that the appointment of the Commission had in the first place the object of shelving the question and that from its completion the Commission was likely to produce both a majority and a minority report, with the majority in favor of license and a minority prohibition.

Now the word comes that Mr. Skinner the chairman of the commission, has been obtaining statistics from liquor dealers in Saint John of their shipments to the Island and is "amazed" at the result. Liquor dealers' statistics would no doubt be amazing enough when they have so much at stake. It is evident that at least one member of the Commission is already sufficiently inspired to make the report against prohibition, which apparently was the object sought for, as was the case with the Royal Commission appointed by the Federal Government in 1892.

The Guardian is informed that at the recent meeting of the Executive Council a committee composed of Hon. Messrs. Peters, Hazard, McNutt, Agnew and Capt. Read was appointed to assess the damages and formulate a claim against the Dominion for the non-fulfillment of the terms of union in regard to transportation. This action, if our information is correct, is both timely and important. The bill for damages ought to be presented and payment insisted upon year by year until constant and efficient steam service summer and winter is assured. We must not sleep upon our rights in a matter so vital to the welfare of the Province. And, if we mistake not, the Tunnel question will be very much to the front in both the provincial and federal elections now approaching.

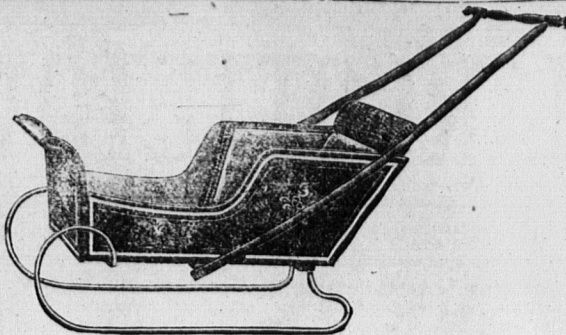

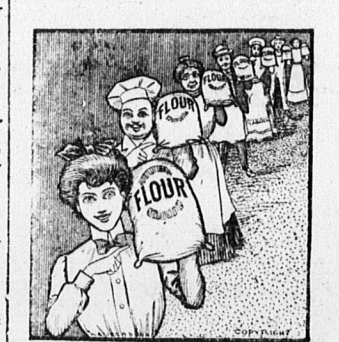
