MAGISTRATE'S COURT - A number of cases have been heard by Magistrate R. S. Hinton in Summerside this week. A woman from Spring Valley was convicted under the Excise Act and fined \$150 or two months in jail, it being her second offence. Another woman, from Borden, was fined \$10 and costs for possession of beer under the Prohibition Act. Two parties from Summerside convicted under the Excise Act and fined \$25 and costs each or one month in jail. A party from Fortage was fined \$5.00 and costs under the Highway Traffic Act. A case under the Prohibition Act against a Summerside man, charged with knowingly permitting a person to use his premises for the sale of intoxicating liquor, was adjourned for a week. -S.

The boys were charged with petty thefts from the stores of groceries, of candy, and breaking a car window in order to steal a flashlight, and theft of groceries from a baby carriage left standing in front of a store; also theft of several bicycles.
