With Holland's army valiantly fighting its own on the frontier, the German army in the Rotterdam area. In a two-hour assault, Dutch forces recaptured Rotterdam from Nazi paratroopers. German aircraft filled the skies, and Holland's troops throughout southern Netherlands held their positions everywhere. The island of Bonaire, linking Holland and Surinam by a bridge, was held in a battle which cost 1,000 lives.
