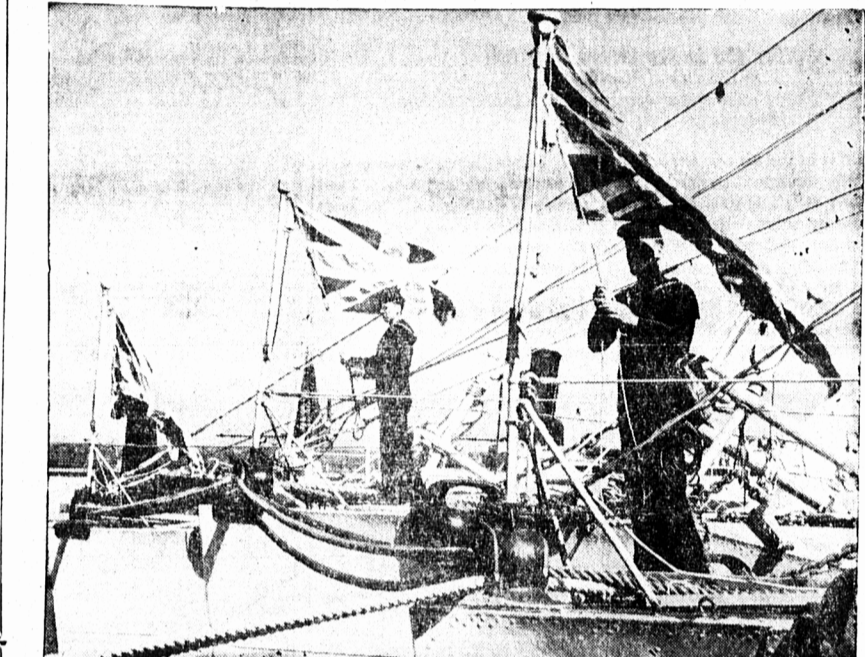
R. A. F. KEEPS HAMMERING AT BARGES

LONDON, Sept. 17.—(CP)—The power of wind, blowing fog and British bombers united today to prevent any immediate Nazi attempt to put soldiers on these islands, but Prime Minister Churchill warned the people that enemy preparations for invasion still continue hourly.

Says Hitler Plans Attack On America

WINNIPEG, Sept. 17.—(CP)—Carl J. Hambro, president of the Norwegian parliament, said in an interview today that he believed Hitler planned an attack on North America as his next step, rather than an attempted invasion of the British Isles.

ITALIAN ARMY CONTINUES IN DESERT DRIVE

CAIRO, Egypt, Sept. 17.—(AP)—Italian motorized troops penetrated tonight beyond Sidi Barrani, almost 60 miles inside Egypt from Libya, reaching the beginning of an asphalt road which runs from the coastal road to the Suez Canal, vital link of Britain's empire life-line.

Waves Of Nazis Planes Dispersed Over Kent Area

LONDON, Sept. 18.—(Wednesday)—(CP)—A howling 100-mile-an-hour hurricane joined forces with British fighters high above the Kentish countryside last night to disperse waves of more than 200 German warplanes, but the Nazi bombers returned in abating weather early today to maintain their "death patrol" over London's rooftops.

AN EAST COAST CANADIAN PORT, Sept. 17.—(CP)—Royal Navy officers aboard ships of the first flotilla of American destroyers to be transferred to Britain welcomed with enthusiasm here tonight news of the new names chosen for the vessels.

Britons Warned Invasion Will Be Attempted

Churchill Has Words Of Confidence To Cheer Nation—12,000 Dead Or Wounded Since Early Aug.

LONDON, Sept. 17.—(CP)—Prime Minister Churchill flailed Britons today to constant vigilance against a German invasion, which he said would come, at what Hitler judges "his best opportunity" in the wake of bombing which killed or wounded 10,000 in the first 15 days of September.

Daily Rioting In Morocco Is Reported

TANGIER, Internationalized zone, Morocco, Sept. 17.—(AP)—Daily rioting in Casablanca, French Morocco, between supporters of the Vichy government and of Gen. Charles de Gaulle, leader of the Free French forces fighting with Britain, was reported today in usually reliable quarters.

Indo-China Crisis Moves To Showdown

Ship Ashore On Anticosti; Crew Aboard

PORT MENIER, Anticosti Island, Que., Sept. 17.—(CP)—Fifteen of the 45 crew members of the stricken British freighter Incomore were taken off the vessel tonight before heavy seas made it impossible for the remaining men to make their way to shore.

War Loan Reaches 272 Million Mark

OTTAWA, Sept. 17.—(CP)—Cash subscriptions for Canada's 2nd War Loan reached \$272,346,200 tonight, after a heavy day of individual orders, loan headquarters here announced.

Casualties Are Heavy In Raids In September

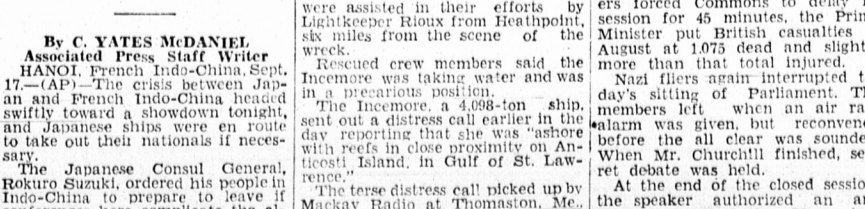
Two Fliers Killed In Training Plane
