**Persecution Of Protestants In Bulgaria**

NEW YORK, Feb. 16 — (AP) — A report which said "outright persecution" of Bulgarian Protestants began in January, 1948, on secret orders from Communist central headquarters in Sofia was given the Associated Press today by a traveler returned from Europe.

The traveler stipulated that neither his name nor his connections nor the source of his report could be disclosed.

The report, which said that between 30 and 40 pastors of the United Evangelical Church were jailed during 1948, was prompted by the Communist-dominated government's recent announcement of the imprisonment of 15 church leaders.

They were charged with acting as spies for the United States and Britain, treason and violating the foreign currency law.

(Represented in the United Evangelical Church are Congregational, Methodist, Baptist and Pentecostal faiths.)

The report said the campaign against the church got underway in January of last year when the Communist central headquarters in Sofia sent a directive for the "local agitators of the fatherland front (the Communist party)."

This directive, the report said, accused Evangelical pastors of indulging "in a policy of undermining the foundations of the people's power."

"These pastors intend to demobilize the people and to divert them from their only path to salvation, the path of democracy and socialism," the report quoted the directive as saying.

The directive then ordered "the local agitator" to go to "their meetings in church, and to ask them the following questions: 1. What is your attitude toward the building of our state and the power of the fatherland party? 2. If you have a positive attitude, how do you express it practically? 3. From where do you obtain the financial backing for your church and pastor? 4. What is your attitude toward the policy of the Anglo-Americans aiming to kindle a new war and to enslave foreign peoples? and 5. Why do you not speak out against inciters of war?"

A number of arrests and beatings of clergymen followed, the report said.

In June, 1948, the report said, the government addressed a circular letter of directive to all church leaders, that they should:

1. "Not criticize the government; support nationalism; acknowledge and preach that the state stands above the church; support fully all government measures and train theological students to fulfil government obligations."

In addition, the directive stated that "since every Bulgarian is expected to become a member of the fatherland front," all pastors and priests must join the group and "should counteract anti-Communist and anti-Russian propaganda from the pulpit and church press; should display portraits of government leaders in the churches and should preach love for state leaders."

"The churches made certain concessions through their publications and the ministry of foreign affairs assumed editorial control."

"Nonetheless, in July, 13 pastors were imprisoned and their correspondence taken by the government to be read."

"By November between 30 and 40 in all were in prison."
