Had To "Give Away" Premier King Portrait

TORONTO, Oct. 18—James McCausland, former Conservative member of the Ontario Legislature for Toronto South West, charged with fraud in connection with his obtaining a portrait of Prime Minister Mackenzie King from a Toronto firm of pawnbrokers, said in court today he had taken "the darn thing" to see if he could sell it but finally had given it away.

I thought that was a better price for it than in pawn shop," McCausland said. "While I am a Conservative, I did not think a pawnshop was a good place for the Premier's picture. I rather like him and think he is a good Premier."

John Spence, an employee of the pawnbrokers, said the portrait, valued at \$12.50, had been taken by McCausland on approval and never returned.

In court today McCausland pleaded not guilty to the fraud charge and said he would pay the \$12.50. He was given until Friday to get the money.

See New Serum As Control For Pneumonia

PITTSBURGH, Oct. 18—For the first time in history pneumonia may be brought under control during the coming winter.

The disease is the third leading "public health enemy" in the United States, but according to reports before the American Public Health Association meeting here today, science has a promise of conquering it more effectively than with any previous known methods.

Serums and oxygen tents, along with adequate nursing care, have until recently been the principal methods of treating pneumonia. These will still be used in this winter's campaign.

However, Dr. Lloyd D. Felton of the National Institute of Health, Washington, D. C., told the association that "great promise" exists in the use of vaccination against the disease. The new vaccination lasts only for about one year, but appears in preliminary experiments to be quite effective in preventing the disease.

The third method of combatting the disease, which kills more than 100,000 persons each year, is the use of sulfa pyridine, the drug which stops the pneumococcus germs from growing until the defensive white blood cells of the body can overcome them.
