NEWFOUNDLAND TRADE WITH CANADA GROWING

In Both Imports and Exports. Ottawa Fears Water Famine Because the River Runs Low. Church Organs and Water-power Factories Are in Trouble.

OTTAWA, Nov. 23.—(Special)—There are strong prospects of a serious water famine in Ottawa. The city takes its supply from the Ottawa river, which is so low that the intake pipes are very shallowly covered and frost would likely freeze them.

The pressure on the city mains is maintained by a water-driven pump, and the pressure has been so reduced that ten or twelve churches are without instrumental music, the power be-

ing shut off from them. A number of industries must shut down unless rains come before the river freezes. The department of Commerce has received a report giving the figures of the trade of Newfoundland. The total trade for 1907 was \$23,331,570, as against \$22,527,201 in the year previous. The exports to Canada were \$1,863,864. The imports from Canada were \$4,257,648.

NEGOTIATIONS ARE GOING ON

Between Grand Trunk Company and Allan Company for Atlantic Steam Service.

MONTREAL, Nov. 23.—(Special)—Although neither side will affirm or deny the matter, it is stated on good authority that the Grand Trunk officials have opened negotiations with the Allan line for an agreement by which the Allan Line at the opening of the road will provide a fleet of boats to make connection on the Atlantic seaboard with the railway's passenger and freight trains. The fleet to be under the control of the Railway. The Atlantic ports, according to the plan now under consideration, would be Montreal and Saint John, Portland being left out altogether.

Murray was named commander of the 7th Hussars at Bury, Quebec, and Captain R. A. Klock has been appointed paymaster. Command of the 83rd Joliette Regiment has been given to Major J. E. B. Normandeau with the rank of lieutenant-colonel. He succeeds Colonel E. C. Piche, transferred to the reserve list.

SAD FATE OF MONCTON GIRL

MONCTON, Nov. 22.—Some facts have been learned regarding the death of Gertrude McLellan, whose sudden death occurred on Sunday. It appears the girl was a victim of wood alcohol. She was of weak mind, and threatened to do away with herself. On Friday last, she drank a quantity of the alcohol, and on Sunday the poison began to take effect. Although three doctors were called and everything possible done, she died in convulsions.

ANOTHER FIRE FROM COAL OIL

Used in Kindling Causes Two Deaths, As Funeral Was Leaving House.

LOCUST CORNER, Ore., Nov. 23.—(Special)—An explosion of coal oil used in starting a fire here caused the death of Albert Bradbury, fatally burned Mrs. Emick Carvin, slightly injuring two small children. The explosion occurred just as the funeral party of Aaron Bradbury, uncle of the dead girl, was leaving the house. Another member of the family was ill of typhoid fever at the time. The undertaker rescued Mrs. Carvin. The house was only slightly damaged.

GERMAN BALLOON WAS FIRED ON

As it Crossed Russian Frontier Flying German Flag. Some Bullets Struck.

BRESLAU, Nov. 23.—(Special)—A German balloon which passed over Russian territory on Saturday was fired on by the Russian frontier guards. Fifteen shots were fired in spite of the fact that the balloon was flying the German flag. The bullets hissed around the airship and one pierced a sack of ballast and was imbedded in the sand. The aeronauts made a hurried descent, landing German territory. They were not hurt.

TURF RECORDS FOR YEAR 1908

HALIFAX, Nov. 22.—The annual record of the season on the turf in the Maritime Provinces shows some grand performances during the past year, and particularly gratifying results among the trotters, with the record for the Maritime Provinces being lowered. Terrace Queen, 2.06, owned by Charles F. DeWitt, Bridgetown, is the Queen of the provincial turf, in pacing the fast mile of the year, 2.14, and winning five of the seven free-for-alls in which she started. Estill Boy, owned by the Springhill Stables, is the champion trotter who lowered the Maritime Provinces record, his own, to 2.16. The Springhill Stables also have the honor of having the fastest green horse of the season in Dessie Patch, which came to the provinces without a record and took a mark of 2.15 at Halifax. Anita, owned by B. A. Combett, Halifax, is not only the fastest green trotter of the year, but is Province bred. Sleepy Jack, owned by R. P. Fraser of McLellan's Brook, N. S., is the fastest Province bred gelding of the year, and has a record of 2.21. Will-Be-Sure, owned by Nat McNaair, River Louison, N. B., reduced his record to 2.15. Idle Moments, the pacing 4-year-old is owned by F. Duncanson, St. John, N. B. Prince Edward Island makes a splendid showing in the record list. Kalol, the fastest trotting station, is owned by R. H. Sterns, Charlottetown, and entered the 2.20 list; Lon Helen, the fastest trotting mare and the winner of a number of races, is owned by John McPhee, of Free-town; George Cresceus, the great three-year-old, is owned by Frank Beales, Charlottetown; Israel Tarte, the champion 4-year-old trotter, is the property of E. Crosby, Cape Traverse and Lady Commodore, the 3-year-old pacer, is owned by D. O'Brien, Charlottetown.

FAMOUS PAINTER DIES IN POVERTY

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—Mrs. Imogene Morrell, a celebrated portrait and historical painter, died early today in the small room of a lodging-house, alone and friendless, and amid surroundings of squalor and distress. Mrs. Morrell enjoyed the distinction of being the only woman whose paintings occupied a place in the United States capitol, she having painted the notable picture of Gen. John A. Dix. More than two hundred works of her brush were destroyed in a disastrous fire twelve years ago. She was a native of Attleboro, Mass.

INVENTOR STARVES.

Cincinnati, Nov. 21.—Patrick J. Crendon, aged forty-five an inventor, and a native of Peterboro, Ont., was found dead recently in his room at the Burnet house. Dr. Coe of the coroner's staff stated he believed death to be due to natural causes, probably a hemorrhage brought on as the result of starvation.

LEGISLATION FOR THE IRISH FARMER

Chief Secretary Birrell to Introduce his Land Bill on Monday Next.

LONDON, Nov. 22.—The Irish land bill which Mr. Birrell will introduce on Monday next will propose a readjustment of the financial clauses of Mr. Wyndham's act by placing the bonus paid to the landlord on a sliding scale. The bonus will be in proportion to the price demanded by the landlord, so that a high price will be accompanied by a small bonus, and vice versa. A new loan will be raised for Irish land stock to facilitate sales. The Congested Districts Board is to be reorganized and placed under the control of the Department of Agriculture, which will receive a grant of two hundred thousand dollars for the development of technical education.

The bill will also contain a proposal for the compulsory purchase of grazing lands, and a new authority will be set up to administer these powers. In any event the bill will be rapidly pushed through all its stages. If it is opposed it will be held over by a special resolution until next session. In the meantime it is hoped that the publication of the government's proposals will allay agitation in Ireland. Finally, the bill is so framed that if the House of Lords refuses to pass it, the peers will deprive the Irish landlords of the purchase money for their estates for which they are clamoring.

FRIGHTENED TO DEATH BY MOUSE

Cat Was Pursuing it. Young Woman Collapsed Dying of Heart Failure.

FLORENCE, N. J., Nov. 23.—(Special)—Having a horror of mice since childhood, Miss Mary Mead died of fright when a mouse, pursued by a cat darted across the kitchen floor. Seeing the mouse she succumbed and was carried in a state of collapse to a lounge. Shortly afterwards she complained of a pain in her heart. Her mother hurried to procure restoratives, but when she returned the young woman was dead. Heart trouble caused by fright was the cause of death.

START IS MADE IN RELAY RACE

NEW YORK, Nov. 22.—More than one thousand boy runners took part in the Y. M. C. A. relay race to Washington, which started from this city Friday. Bearing a silver tube containing a message to President Roosevelt, the first youngster whisked away from the international branch of the Y. M. C. A. in Twenty-eighth street. He was quickly relieved, however, the distance for each relay being limited to 150 yards. In the race to Chicago last summer each runner covered more than half a mile. The boy who was selected to make the start was appropriate for the occasion. He is George Washington Wilson, of the Washington Heights Y. M. C. A. As there will be no running throughout the night, which is a departure from the rules of the race to Chicago, the tube will not reach Washington until late Saturday.

LONE BANDIT ROBS 60.

CHICAGO, Nov. 22.—Sixty gamblers were held up at the point of a revolver and robbed of nearly four thousand in cash and jewelry by a lone highwayman who entered a gambling house in West Hammond while the players were betting, according to a report made to detective headquarters recently, by one of the victims who wanted to get his money back. He said the robber got seventeen hundred dollars in cash and two thousand dollars in jewelry. The gamblers were lined up against the wall by the robber who carried two revolvers.

THREE KILLED IN TRAIN WRECK

An Open Switch On Which Train Was Standing, Was the Fatal Cause.

PONTIAC, Nov. 23.—(Special)—A disastrous wreck occurred on the C. P. R. half way between Pontiac and Burketon in which three men were killed. A light engine travelling east was waiting on a siding and some one had neglected to close the switch. A doubleheader freight train going west crashed into the freight and engine, on the siding. The engineer, brakeman and fireman of the freight were killed.

DIVORCED BY TWO WIVES ONE DAY

NEW YORK, Nov. 22.—A queer complication was revealed before Justice Bischoff in the Supreme Court recently when two women obtained divorces from the same man. The man is Frank L. Winfield and the women are Winona L. Winfield and Harriet B. Winfield. Mrs. Winona Winfield asked an absolute divorce on the ground of her husband's second marriage, and Mrs. Harriet Winfield asked for an annulment of her marriage on the ground that at the time her husband had another wife living in the person of Winona, from whom he had not been divorced.
