NEW YORK, March 29—(AP)—Although spot rates of major European currencies held their ground in relation to the United States dollar today, discounts on future prices widened sharply. The Pound Sterling, for instance, could be had for 2 1-8 cents less than the spot rate in 90 days, which compared with a discount of 1 1-2 cents Tuesday. Discount on the 90-day franc shot up to 40 of a cent from 34 of a cent. Spot Sterling declined 1-16 of a cent to 4 68 1-8 while the franc advanced 1-16 of a cent to 2 64 7-8. The gulder and Swiss franc were unchanged but the belga was a shade down. Canadian funds were at a discount of 15-32 compared with 1-2 yesterday.

WINNIPEG, March 29—(CP)—Late of active interest from buyers and sellers held Winnipeg wheat futures prices within a narrow range throughout a dull session today. Values dipped slightly at the opening and closed 1-8 cent lower, with May at 60 1-8, July 60 7-8 and Oct. 61 3-4. Liverpool finished 1-4d lower to 1-4d ahead. Chicago recorded small gains while Buenos Aires was unchanged to 1-8 cent down. Trading in cash wheat and coarse grains was featureless.
