And now Elijah Dowie denies that the millionaire heiress Ruth Hofr is to marry his son Gladstone. But the young people are yet to be heard from.

A squadron of the United States ships has been sent to Smyrna to forcibly remind the Sultan of Turkey that it will be prudent to attend to some urgent diplomatic notifications sent him from Washington hitherto unanswered.

The Novosti newspaper at St. Petersburg takes a philo-sophic view of the British expedition in Tibet, saying, "it is natural and right that Lhasa should be forced to forego her long exclusion of civilization". This is a milder comment than could be expected if the Russian army were not just now very busy.

The total attendance at the World's Fair, St. Louis from April 30 to August 6 inclusive was 6,258,988. The largest attendance was on the opening day, 187,783 and the next largest was August 6 when the number was 137,167. The first week in August was also the largest week's attendance, the total being 601,411 for the six days.

The matter of indistinct postmarks on letters was brought up in the British Parliament the other day. There is much need for like attention in Canada, not excluding this Island. Every letter that passes through the mails should bear a clear impression of the name of the office and the date at which it was received and a like clear record of the office at its destination. There is a great deal of blurred and indistinct stamping done, especially at country post offices in Prince Edward Island, so much so that it is usually very difficult to ascertain the date when a letter was posted, and in many cases the name of the office cannot be made out. The attention of the Post Office Inspector is directed to this matter.

According to an Ottawa despatch to an evening paper the Anglo-American Telegraph Company will do what it can to prevent the introduction of wireless telegraphy in Prince Edward Island. Something of the motive of the dog in the manger with an admixture of the spirit of the highwayman is suggested to the mind by this attitude. The company will neither voluntarily give a modern telegraph service at rates current elsewhere, nor will it if it can prevent it; our people to get a telegraph service in another way. If it can save off competition it will hold up the Government for such a 'ditional subsidy as it can exact. The situation is one which calls for heroic treatment and it should be at once applied. Neither the Government's freedom of action nor the rights of a free people should be held in a moment at the mercy of this petty monopoly.

Many immigrants from Europe pass through Canada on their way to the United States. The latter country has very properly protected itself by law against receiving persons suffering from dangerous or contagious disease, or likely to become a public charge. During the past fiscal year 2,441 such immigrants were turned back at the American border, and the inference is that they are scattered through western Canada. During the session just closed legislation was enacted to prevent the admission of these classes and it is important that protective measures shall be rigidly enforced. Canada must not become the dumping ground for the disease and pauperism of the Old World. That it has been so to a considerable extent has been seriously felt in the western Provinces during several years past. As few if any immigrants come to Prince Edward Island, we have not seen the effect in our immediate midst, but it is a matter of national concern that some thousands of diseased or paupers, which the United States refused were dumped into Canada.

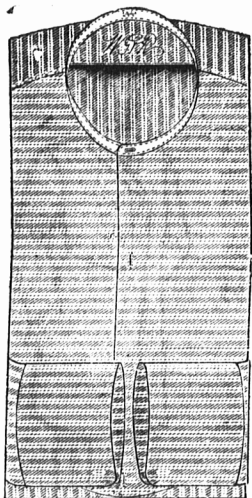
