Described By a Charlottetown Gentleman Who Resides There.

WORKS SECOND TO NONE ON THE CONTINENT

The Mansion has Replaced the Indian Wigwam—How to t the Works and How the Thousands of Employees are Handled. An Expensive Place to Live.

Sydney is a progressive town; so much so that its population has been trebled, and its business in general increased ten-fold during the past ten months. The influence of this great boom has not only been of lasting benefit to its adjacent districts, but to the Maritime Provinces as well, and I may say, particularly to Prince Edward Island, from which place an amazing amount of produce has been shipped to the two Sydneys and their surrounding villages. All this is the result of the inauguration in South Sydney of the Dominion Iron and Steel Company, which was brought about safely by the labors of that financial magnate, Henry M. Whitney of Boston, Mass.

THE CHANGE OF A YEAR.

Any one who had the pleasure of attending the summer carnival and regatta held at Sydney just one year ago, would if he went back now on a visit, readily appreciate the tremendous metamorphosis that has been wrought in the appearance of the town. Streets on which luxuriant green grass grew, even in the cart ruts, are now skirted by splendid new residences and mammoth business blocks, and the main thoroughfare for business activity and bustling crowds, will compare favorably, with any in the Dominion.

THE WORKS SECOND TO NONE ON THE CONTINENT.

Over the creek bridge which leads from the town to the site of the works, one gets a glimpse of the site of the works, one gets a glimpse of the industry that is undoubtedly to be second to none on the continent, not even excepting the great industries of Duquesne, Pa., or those of the world-renowned works at Homestead P. A.

CONSTRUCTION OF MAMMOTH FURNACES.

Where the Mimacs wigwam reposed in humble and silent happiness, only twelve months ago, is now the place of abode of four giant blast furnaces that stand like the "Silent Sentry of Shipka," with their Eiffelian domes nestling in the peaceful blue sky. The work of construction of these furnaces, which are not yet completed, is indeed a marvel in itself. A solid concrete wall one thousand feet in length serves as a foundation for them. Each furnace has four enormous "stoves" and one smokestack, the latter being something over two hundred feet high. The foundations for the boiler and engine house are also of concrete, an excavation of about thirty feet having first been made and then supplanted by the concrete. The boiler and engine houses are about three hundred feet long and something like seventy feet wide. All the roofs are made of steel. The apparent simplicity and ease with which all heavy material, etc., is hoisted and moved from one place to the other is wonderful, but the most modern hoisting contrivances, run by electricity and controlled by a single individual, explain the trick. All the iron and brick work is done by Wrighter & Connolly, of Pittsburg, Pa.

HOW TO VISIT THE WORKS.

Any one wishing to visit the great works must procure a "pass" in order to do so. A fence completely surrounds the works, with gates here and there guarded by policemen. Even the workman are excluded from entering unless they can produce their "check," if requested to do so. This is done in order to keep out the hundreds of folks who daily seek admittance.

The magnificent foundry and machine shop are also in the same enclosure as the furnaces, while in another locality is situated the coke ovens, where over one thousand men are employed. All the different works, when completed, will be run by electricity, the electric plant at the works being one of the finest in the country.

THOUSANDS OF MEN EMPLOYED.

These great concerns naturally employ a big force of men, something like four thousand being engaged; and although the skilled mechanics are composed chiefly of Americans, principally from Pittsburg, Pa., still there are to be found a great number of Canadians, including many P. E. Islanders, all of whom command good wages—the average being about \$4.50 per day and upwards. These are about the only people at the works who are able to save any money worth speaking of, notwithstanding reports to the contrary. The ordinary workmen who do not receive over \$2.25 per day—and there are few who do, except the aforementioned—are certainly only working for the usual wages and if he be a married man he will find it difficult indeed to make both ends meet.

AN EXPENSIVE PLACE TO LIVE.

It is a notorious fact that Sydney is, at present, about the dearest place in America for one to live in—a regular Klondyke in that respect. Boarding houses are so filled up that it is quite impossible to secure lodgings. Last winter and early spring many people who arrived by late train were unable to find a bed to lay on and were compelled to walk the streets all night while others more fortunate found rest on the bare floors of the station house.
