300 Canadian Army Boxers In Running

OTTAWA, April 10.—(CP)—Three hundred of the 15,000 Canadian army boxers who started out in quest of Dominion titles remain in the running and five zones across the country are slated to name semi-finalists by April 22, the defence department said today. The Dominion finals will be started here May 4.

In the east, the semi-finals of the big knock-out tourney will be held at Petawawa Camp, Ont., April 29.

As the tourney now stands, the three eastern zones are rounding off their district eliminations. In the first zone, the Toronto district has named Fort York Armories, Toronto, as the scene for finals April 16. Camp Borden elimination will be held April 19, and the London, Ont., district champions will be declared April 11 and 12. The winners from these districts tankie at Borden April 29.

The ultimate winner will receive a gold statuette of a boxer for his mastery in the national title. Aces unleashed a six-round barrage in the final period for an 8-3 win that gave them the eastern Canadian hockey championship, three times to none.

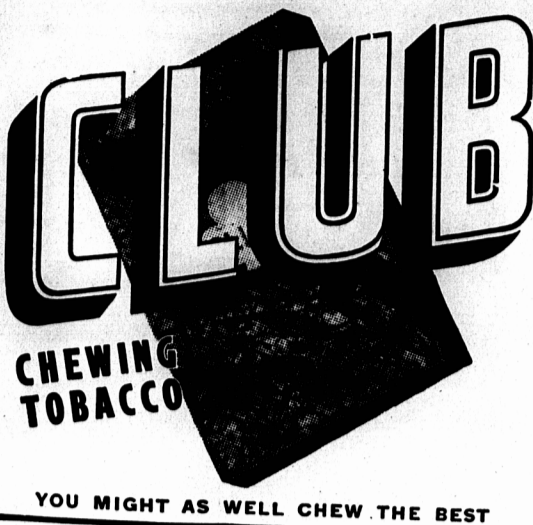

Generals took the best of five series by 3-1 after they took both games with Royals in Toronto, lost here Saturday and completed things here tonight.

Generals will now meet Trail Smoke Eaters in the last round for the Memorial Cup.

Lindsay broke the scoring ice for Oshawa in the initial frame after a solo rush from the blue line. Oshawa added three more in the final frame to one tally by Royals. Curry, Lindsay, Smith were the Generals' snipers while Hamel scored for Royals.

St. John Boxer Wins Maritime Middle Title

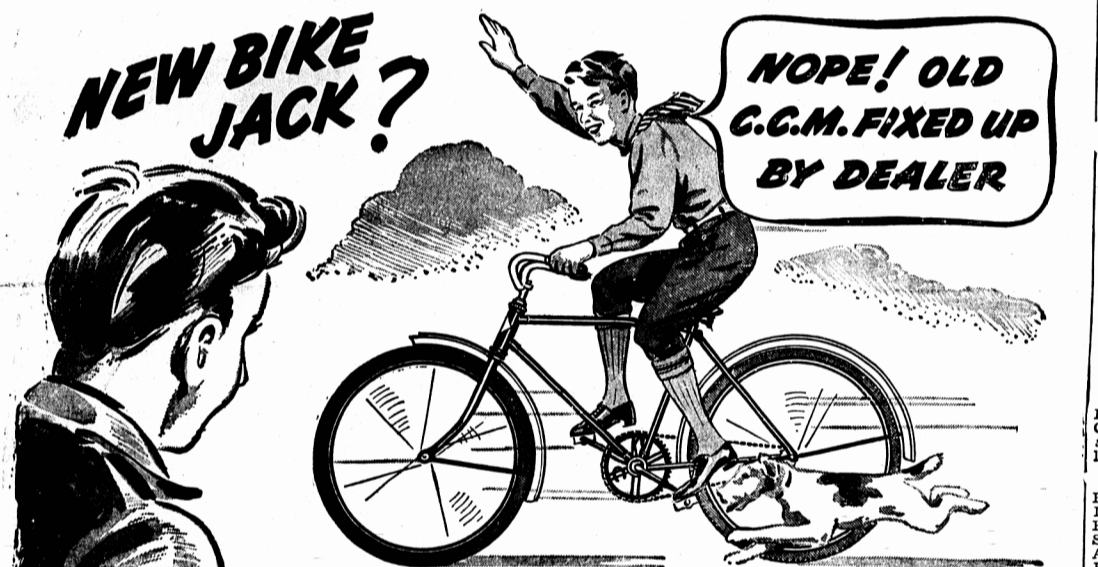

the president, who assumed office Dec. 1, 1940, was not immediately announced.

Avila Camacho is a quiet-mannered son of one of Mexico's two major revolutions and of numerous rebellions. When he took office he was faced with the task of uniting the country which had been badly divided by a turbulent campaign.

On his shoulders rested the problem of putting Mexico's complex economic and political problems in order.

Led by Avila Camacho, Mexico declared war on the Axis as of May 22, 1942, after repeated U-boat attacks on Mexican shipping for which the Axis refused either to take responsibility or to make reparations.

Immediately after the declaration Mexican troops moved into positions on the Pacific and Gulf coasts.

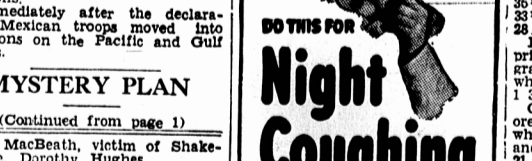
