

**HALIFAX WILL LOSE.**

HALIFAX, June 6.—At a meeting of the public accounts committee tonight it was stated that Halifax will lose \$21,000 yearly in taxes by the amalgamation of the People's Bank and the Bank of Montreal. It was decided that legislation be sought at the next session to increase the revenue derived from banks doing business in this city. At the present the tax is at the rate of 3.5 of one per cent on the capital.

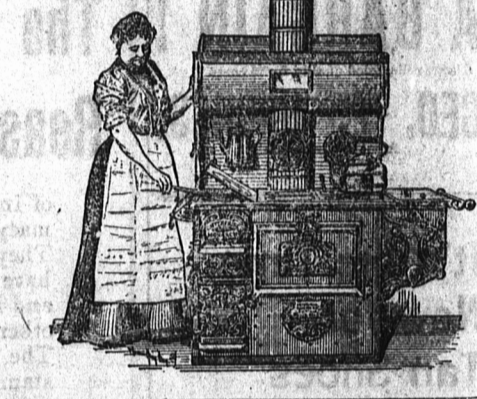
