by the loss of a leading Liberal Province which the combined efforts of two governments failed to save. Dark portents of what may happen in the less Liberal Province of New Brunswick now becloud the minds of the distracted Cabinet, for if the Veniot Government should fall, or even suffer the loss of half its majority, as it is almost certain to do, what hope remains for the federal Liberal party?

To hold on till the parliamentary term expires is not an alluring prospect. Premier Armstrong tried it and the result is seen. Since the Dominion was formed defeat has usually followed a last minute appeal to the country. Premier Veniot's time is up and he must face the issue. The King Government may yet have a few brief months at respite from inevitable defeat. Cowardice and greed prompt the Ottawa spoliators to hold on till the last gasp, even with the certainty of a more crushing disaster at the end.

IN MEMORIAM

W. B. MURDOCK.

Many in this Province will read with deep regret of the death of Mr. Murdock who was an annual visitor there for over 40 years. A fine citizen of Amherst, a man who had innumerable friends and no enemies passed away at Highland View Hospital Thursday evening June 18th Amherst in the person of W. B. Murdock. Mr. Murdock had been the victim of an intractable disease for some time but until two weeks ago he was about as usual, and no one who met him on the street or had a cheery word from him, could dream that the end was so near. His strength failed him suddenly and after he was taken to the Hospital, it was realized that nothing could be done to save his life. Mr. Murdock was born in Wainchendon, Mass., but when he was three years old his parents removed to Toronto. Later he went to Montreal where he spent his boyhood days and where he was educated. Thirty-seven years ago he moved to Amherst, where he has made his home ever since. Mr. Murdock was a Manufacturer's Agent, representing a number of Upper Canadian firms in the Maritime provinces for many years. He was forty-three years on the road and it is safe to say he was one of the most popular travellers in the Maritime Provinces. He always had an equable disposition, and a pleasant word for everybody. He had a host of close personal friends who will be greatly pained to hear of his death. Mr. Murdock was a staunch Methodist, and a member of Ivy Lodge I. O. O. F. Under whose auspices the funeral took place on Friday afternoon at 2.30 o'clock. He is survived by his widow, who was formerly Miss Ella Clark of Brighton, Ont., and five children Carl D. of Amherst, Alfred of Toronto, H. Ward of Truro, Mrs. James O. Rodger of Amherst and Florence at home. To all of these there will be the deepest sympathy in their great bereavement.
