SHOOTS AT RANDOM. WOUNDS TWO BOYS. DETROIT, Nov. 10—Hearing tonight in the backyard of her home, where she had a rabbit hutch, Mrs. Cavada, 9029 Lyon street, opened a rear window and fired five shots from a .38-cal. revolver. Scrambled followed the shots, and neighbors who investigated found two boys, aged 9 and 10, respectively, lying bleeding on the ground near the hutch. 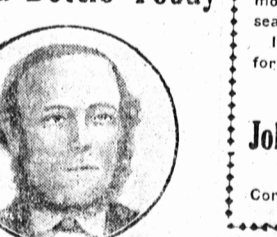

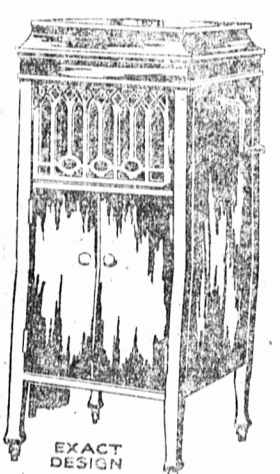

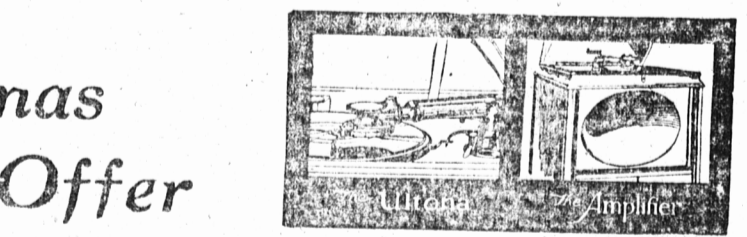
