ROOSEVELT AND FAIRBANKS.

By unanimous voice the great Re-
publican National Convention at Chicago
selected President Roosevelt as its candi-
date for President and Senator Fairbanks
for Vice President. No other nomination
was made and amid thunders of applause
lasting twenty-five minutes the choice of
the convention was acclaimed. Ex-Gov-
ernor Black of New York, who was chosen
to make the nomination of the President
sounded a distinctly military note in his
speech. One passage reads:

"The fate of nations is still decided by
their wars. You may talk of orderly
tribunals and learned referees; you may
sing in your schools the gentle praises of
the quiet life; you may strike from your
books the last note of every martial
anthem, and yet out in the smoke and
thunder will always be the tramp of
horses and the silent, rigid, upturned
face. Men may prophesy and women
pray, but peace will come here to abide
forever on this earth only when the
dreams of childhood are the accepted
charts to guide the destinies of men.
Events are numberless and mighty, and
no man can tell which wire runs around
the world. The nation basking today in
the quiet of contentment and repose may
still be on the deadly circuit and tomorrow
writhing in the coils of war. This is the
time when great figures must be kept in
front. If the pressure is great the material
to resist it must be granite and iron."

This sounds not unlike an echo of the
"war-lord" address by the German Kaiser
in his reign. We are told that the
convention roared its approval of Gov-
ernor Black's sentiments. The delegates
have no fear of the President's strenuous
militarism, his Rough Rider foreign
policy or of the Democratic cry that he is
unsafe and reckless. Very probably, in
the present divided state of the Democra-

tic party, the unanimous choice of the
Republicans will prove to be the choice of
the nation. "Protection and more pro-
tection" is the tariff platform, scarcely
qualified by this rather inopportune
reference to reciprocity: The party's
belief "in the adoption of all practical
methods for the extension of foreign
markets, including commercial reciprocity
wherever reciprocal arrangements can be
perfected consistent with the principle
of protection, and without injury to
American agriculture, labor or any Amer-
ican industry." This as interpreted
across the border shuts out any plan of
reciprocity which Canadians could pos-
sibly accept.

celebration the maritime metropolis has
yet seen and one of the best yet witnessed
in Canada. The City of the Loyalists has
"done itself proud."

Togo is the greatest naval commander
of the age. Always prepared, alert,
vigilant, and quick to strike whenever
the chance offered, he has a third time
crippled the Russian Port Arthur fleet.
At the beginning it was stronger than
his own fleet in battleships, tonnage,
guns and men. With ample time to
repair after its first reverse, it had again
become formidable. Now it is again
crippled. From the beginning the Rus-
sian ships have skulked under shelter of
their shore batteries, "willing to wound
and yet afraid to strike." The Japanese
commander and fleet are of a different
stripe, eager for the fray and well pre-
pared to give a good account of them-
selves in battle.
