JUMPED SIXTY FEET INTO FIRE NETS.

MONTREAL, Aug. 22.—Driven by fire to the roof of the Rideau Shoe Manufacturing Company building in Maisonneuve, yesterday afternoon, a dozen girls, were forced to jump sixty feet into fire nets. Many of them, who took the leap were badly bruised, but only one Patrick Kenan, was seriously injured. He was taken to a hospital.

All of the two hundred employees, either left the building safely by the stairways or were rescued by firemen from the fire escapes. The flames started from an unknown cause in the basement, and quickly shot up the elevator shaft, smoke. The building was completely gutted, entailing a loss of \$125,000, fully covered by insurance.
