DOROTHY DIX SAYS

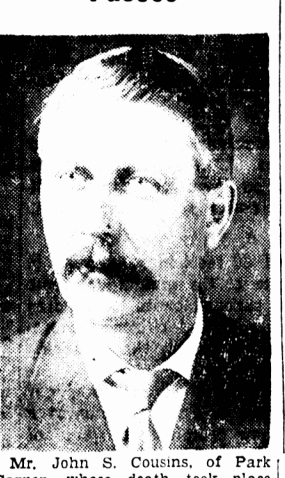
