MURRAY HARBOR.—Captain W. A. Horton with the schooner Bessied Reefer arrived at Murray Harbor from Sidney, C. B. on Dec. 27th. The schooner was coal loaded and was since taken to Georgetown unloaded and returned to Murray Harbor on Jan. 2nd, 1906, the latest arrival of the season.—A large number of vessels belonging to Murray River and Murry Harbor were away at different places when the great December storm came on, but all escaped uninjured except Captain Hater's little schooner which was injured over at New Glasgow, N. S., quite a number of the vessels did not get home but men and vessels are safe.—Captain Gable's schooner Floresta was wrecked before the great snow storm.—The greater part of the snow of the December storm has disappeared and for a time the roads were partly bare but more snow has fallen and now there are fairly good roads.—The ice in Murray River is good and there is considerable travelling on it though it has not yet been lashed. Some of the smaller shells of water however are not so good.—Com.

COMMANDER Spain, who conducted the enquiry into eleven shipping disasters on the St. Lawrence route during the past season, has reported to the marine department. The evidence has been forwarded to the British board of trade to take action thereon with regard to the certificates of those concerned. The commissioner says of the mishaps of the ten following vessels: Montague, Manchester Importer, Manchester Engineer, Sahara, Iberian, Loango, Rustington, Indiana, Bengore Head, and Silician, that these were not caused by any deficiencies or inefficiencies in aids to navigation, either on the ships themselves or on the route. They were caused by the inexperience or carelessness of some one or more of the captains, officers or pilots. The commissioner recommends that owners employ only careful, experienced officers, and that the pilotage system on the St. Lawrence be brought under government control.
