

# Massachusetts Golfer Wins Canadian Ch'ship

## Large Entry List For Race Events Old Home Week

RIVERSIDE, Golf and Country Club, Saint John, N. B., July 31.—(CP)—Smiling Dick Chapman, 38-year-old stock broker from Oysterville, Mass., came through in a grim, uphill struggle Saturday to win the Canadian amateur golf championship. Chapman defeated Phil Farley, of Toronto, at the 38th hole, the second extra hole of the match, in the drama-packed final before a gallery of 2,000. It was the first time Chapman has competed in the Canadian amateur and the third successive year the title has gone to the United States. Defending champion Frank Stranahan of Toledo passed up the picture earlier at the hands of Tommy Riddell, of Montreal, who himself was eliminated by Farley in the semi-final. Farley appeared to have the match safely in hand and it was a heart-breaker for the 37-year-old Torontonian to lose. His short game had Chapman baffled in the morning 18-hole round and Farley was two holes up when they went to lunch. In the afternoon Farley gradually increased his lead until he was five up after 25 holes. Then his strong short game went sour and Chapman, putting better than he ever did throughout the week-long tournament, took command and seized on Farley's mistakes. Ironically, it was the short game that back-fired on Farley. Up to the 25th, he was placing his second shots boldly to the green and closer to the pin than Chapman. Farley tried to play it safe with his lead and it cost him the championship.

## New Attendance Record Set At Local Race Meet Under Lights Saturday

Attendance records for a night race meeting here went by the boards Saturday night when an estimated crowd of well over 5000 jammed into the Exhibition track to witness another evening of sensational fast racing that once again saw favorites beaten as "outsiders" came through to win five of the ten dashes on the program. Driving, nip and tuck struggles in the stretch, duels on the backstretch the second trip around, and closely packed fields battling for the lead as they hit into the number four event in the eighth dash, were part and parcel of the ever-changing picture the fans witnessed over a track that was lightning-fast due to the perfect racing weather predominant.

### Kelly Wins Five Dashes

There were many outstanding features but holding the spotlight was veteran reinsman Willard Kelly's performance in taking horses home in front in five of the events, and also handling the ribbons as Vella La Vella paced the fastest mile of the local season, going the mile in the number four event in 2:08 4-5. Kelly figured in another record-breaking performance also when he took his own Lucky Number from far behind to win the number eight event. The mile was in 1:55, a new record for Lucky Number, displacing his former mark of 2:14.

# More Than 130 Entered In Halifax Tennis Tournery

HALIFAX, July 31.—(CP)—Canada's major tennis show—the Canadian tennis championship—opens here tomorrow with a star-studded field of more than 130 starters, including the Dominion's best and a top-notchers from the United States. Much of the chaff is expected to be blown out in the 72 matches scheduled opening day for the clay courts of three flag-bedecked clubs in this seaport now in the second month of its bicentenary celebration. Halifax got the 1949 event more or less as a birthday gift, and the move has paid off by making Maritimers more tennis-conscious than ever before. The national event never before has been held east of Montreal. The entry list is top-heavy with Maritimers who hope to cause a few surprises before the show is over. Two Halifax players, Don Bauld and Gordon Bauld, are seeded in the first eight and great showings are expected from some promising juniors. Back to defend their singles titles are W. J. (Bill) Tully of Bronville, N.S., and blonde Patricia Mackdon of Montreal. The durable doubles team of Gordon MacNeil and Edgar Lanther, both of Montreal, also is back and expected to live up to the proceedings. They are known for their court showmanship. Three of Canada's 1949 Davis Cup players lead the seedings among the Canadian talent. They are Henri Rochon of Montreal, seeded no. 1, followed in order of seeding by Lorne Main, Vancouver, Jim Macken, Montreal; Walter Stohlberg, Vancouver; J. J. Desjardins, Montreal; Don Bauld; Don Platt, Toronto; and Gordon Bauld. Tully, seeded first among the American invaders, drew a first-round bye and goes against Frank Nolan, promising 18-year-old Halifax player, in the second round. E. Blair Hawley of Cambridge, Mass., and Carleton Wood of New York are seeded second and third respectively. Mrs. Baba Lewis of Jamaica Plain, Mass., 1946 singles champion, is top-seeded among the three American women, followed by Rhoda Joan Hopkins of Wood- haven, N. Y., and Edith Sullivan of Belmont, Mass. Highlighting the opening-round in women's singles is a match between Pat Lowe of Ottawa, young- est woman player, and Mrs. F. V. Woodbury of Halifax, who won the Nova Scotia title back in 1910 but who still puts up a strong argu- ment on a tennis court. Reconstruction Minister R. H. (Bob) Winters of Lunenburg, N.S., who takes an active part in pro- moting sports on Ottawa's Parla- ment Hill, meets one of his con- stituents, Dr. Philip Cole of Ches- ter, N. S., in a first-round match of the men's singles.
