## EDUCATING FOR BETTER POULTRY AND EGGS

The energetic steps taken in the past by notable dealers in dressed poultry and eggs by way of encouraging this industry, which, in many parts of Canada in particular, and as a country on a whole, has occasioned no little interest in this province.

The firm which have been the most active in this respect are the Gunn, Langlois Co., Limited, Montreal, of which a few words here will not be out of place.

They are the largest packing establishment in Canada, having three distinct establishments in Winnipeg, Montreal and Toronto. The total value of the plants alone running up into very high figures. They deal principally in poultry products and export their goods to nearly all parts of the world, handling yearly a very large share of the annual poultry output of the farmers of the Dominion. They cater to a certain class of customers who want the very best procurable and for which prices are realized. In order to be able to supply this demand Gunn, Langlois & Co., are, naturally enough, desirous of obtaining the best on the market.

Through their purchases and their knowledge of the output for 1909 the firm realized that, though there was good money in poultry products for the agriculturist, the supply had fallen off at a remarkable degree and what was offered was not up to the required standard in quality. The company then applied themselves to the task of devising a plan whereby they might establish the poultry business on a firm basis.

To this end they organized an educational company and for this purpose they set aside a large sum of money to be expended annually. As a result there was held in Montreal to

at the firm's warehouse on the 16th and 17th December, but owing to the large number of requests from leading dealers and the general public, it was decided to continue the show for four days of the following week, and the result was that the show rooms were thronged with persons interested in the eggs and poultry business from a producer's as well as a consumer's standpoint.

One of the leading educational features of the exhibit was that every breed of poultry was represented, and as each breed was properly tagged, it made it easy for visitors to make a comparison for themselves. Besides this, expert poultrymen were in attendance all the time, so that fine points could be explained to visitors.

The enthusiasm which this show aroused was doubtless of much value in increasing the interest in poultry products. Producers saw that there is money in poultry if fed and marketed properly; consumers realized that there is a difference between good and poor quality, and that there is economy in buying the high class article. Not only will it help producers to secure "more and better eggs and poultry," but it was one of the greatest educational features to the consumers of the city that has ever been brought forward into the line of dressed poultry.
