SUGGESTS FLOWERS INSTEAD OF CREPE

(Toronto News) The use of flowers instead of crepe for funerals is a subject of discussion among Canadian undertakers just now. In many parts of the United States wreaths of flowers are hung on the outside of the front door, instead of crepe, to denote death. The age of the deceased is indicated by the flowers used. A small wreath or spray of tiny white flowers is chosen for infants and young children. For persons of middle age a larger piece with a mixture of a few light colors is used. In the case of the death of an aged person a wreath or spray of galax leaves, ivy or laurel leaves, or perhaps a sheaf of wheat is seen. "Why should not the same custom be introduced in Canada?" asks The Canadian Florist. "The unexpected sight of a heavy black steamer hanging on the door of a friend gives a shock which would not be felt to the same degree were a wreath or spray of flowers used instead. In the larger cities of the states the use of these wreaths of late years has become general. The sprays may be tied to the door with a white satin ribbon, or fastened otherwise, as the taste may fancy. Sometimes, for elderly ladies, a large bunch of English violets, tied with royal purple ribbon, is a pleasing variation. No standard rule nor style for such a decoration has been adopted as the price of flowers in season, the circumstances of the purchaser, etc., have to be considered."

FAULT LAYS WITH PILOT

QUEBEC, Nov. 21.—The commissioners' inquiry in the Bavarian wreck rendered their decision today. The accident is declared due to the fact that the pilot, Paul Lachance, mistook the St. Thomas buoy for that of St. Margaret, which was extinguished. The pilot is blamed for attaching so much importance to movable buoys as to allow them to affect his judgment against the compass course by which he should have continued to steer. He is therefore declared guilty of a serious blunder and his license as pilot is suspended till July 1, 1907. The punishment would have been more severe but for the excellent reputation he enjoys and his former good character.

WILL AMEND OBNOXIOUS TAX

OTTAWA, Ont., Nov. 21.—The dominion government, it is understood, has received satisfactory assurances from the Province of Quebec that the commercial travellers' tax legislation, against which there have been so many protests from the United States and Great Britain as well as Canada, will be amended at the next session of the legislature. The tax is \$300 on travellers from outside of Canada. P. E. Island started with a \$5 tax, British Columbia made it \$50, and now Quebec says \$300.

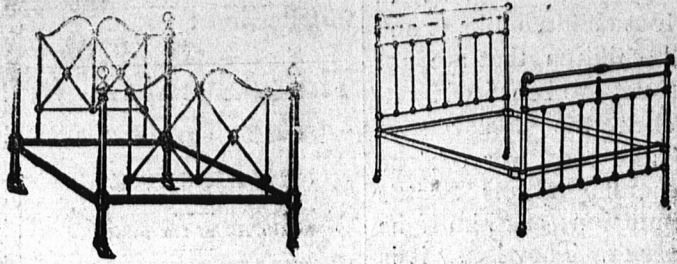

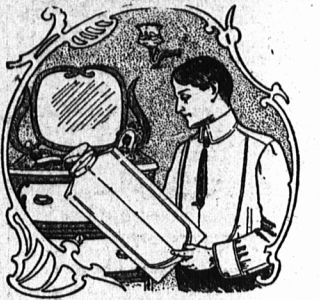
